MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF ELECTORAL OFFICER

Since I became British Columbia's Chief Electoral Officer in 2011, my office has administered six provincial by-elections, three initiative petitions, two recall petitions, one plebiscite, two provincial general elections, and the campaign financing and advertising rules for a general local election, 75 local by-elections and 38 assent voting opportunities. Each type of event, and each individual event, comes with its own challenges, unique circumstances, and surprising moments. On each occasion, my office has risen to the challenge and delivered the high level of service that our stakeholders anticipate and expect.

Of course, the busiest time for any electoral management body is during a general election, and Elections BC is no exception. From a staff of around 55 permanent employees in Victoria, we grow to more than 24,000

across the province. Hundreds of enumerators hit the streets, as district electoral officers (DEOs) open offices in every electoral district and hire thousands of office staff and election officials. Voting places are secured and supplies are delivered. Candidates are nominated and ballots are printed. Where to Vote cards are mailed, the public awareness campaign kicks off, and voting begins.

All this doesn't happen overnight. No sooner do we close the book on one general election than we start planning the next. By the time the campaign signs go up, Elections BC is entering the final leg of a years-long process of preparation and planning. From new electoral boundaries to digital geography products, legislative change to new administrative processes, a successfully delivered general election is the result of hundreds of pieces and thousands of hours of work coming together.

In 2017, there were more pieces than usual. In light of legislative changes enacted in 2015, and recognizing the administrative need and public expectation for modernization of the voting process, new technology and methods were incorporated into the administration of the 2017 Provincial General Election. For the first time, technology was deployed to voting places in a provincial general election in B.C. Tablets, laptops and smart phones were used by field staff and election officials; a new online voter-centric application for finding a voting place was developed; updated voting materials were created to facilitate an accessible voting experience; and a public awareness strategy that recognized the increased importance of social media and other online sources of information was established.

Innovative technological tools facilitated our commitment to accessibility. Elections BC administers more voting opportunities than any other jurisdiction in Canada. Voters can vote in any district electoral office, at special voting opportunities in care facilities or on campus, by mail, or at any advance or general voting place. For the first time, Elections BC administered election official-assisted telephone voting to more than 1,000 voters with disabilities who may otherwise have been unable to cast their ballot. Using new voter look-up technology, election officials were able to administer voting opportunities quickly, efficiently and accurately, providing a high level of service to B.C. voters.

Elections BC also developed a comprehensive outreach and engagement strategy targeting all eligible voters and individuals with identified barriers to electoral participation, such as youth, post-secondary students, Aboriginal people, new Canadians, people with disabilities and homeless people. Working with the unique needs of these groups enabled us to improve the accessibility of the voting process for all British Columbians.

Preparation and planning ensures that we are ready for the significant challenges that can arise during the election period. Several areas of the province were affected by flooding shortly before General Voting Day. As part of our proactive approach to risk management, the possibility of natural disaster was identified ahead of time, and contingency plans were quickly put into place to ensure voters in these areas were not prevented from casting their ballot.

For many, this election will stand out as historically significant. Certainly, the results were very close. After initial count, conducted when polls close on election night, the question of which party (or parties) could ultimately form government hung on a difference of a few votes between two candidates in one electoral district. No party led in a majority of districts. The close results on election night meant all eyes were on the work of Elections BC for the two weeks between election night and the announcement of final results following final count. Recounts were held in two electoral districts, under heavy scrutiny from the media, political parties and the public. After all the votes were counted, just two seats separated the top two parties, resulting in B.C.'s first minority government in more than 60 years.

Elections BC is looking at a busy schedule of events in the period ahead. A provincial by-election has recently been held in Kelowna West. General local elections are scheduled for the fall of 2018. Legislation to conduct a referendum on electoral reform by November 2018 and to change campaign finance rules for provincial and local elections has recently been passed. The election of a minority government in 2017 means my office must now maintain an ongoing state of readiness for a provincial general election, while also delivering other scheduled and on-demand events. We are developing plans and assessing our resource needs to ensure we continue to provide a high level of service to our stakeholders.

Our commitment to innovation, accessibility, engagement and risk management, and to incorporate lessons learned from the 2017 Provincial General Election will continue to guide our work as we prepare for the busy months and years to come.

INTRODUCTION

British Columbia's 41st Provincial General Election was held on May 9, 2017. Eighty-seven Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs) were elected: 43 represented the BC Liberal Party, 41 the BC NDP, and three the Green Party of BC.

Voter turnout was 57.7% of estimated eligible voters and 61.2% of registered voters.

Elections BC conducted an enumeration before the election. Information about the 2017 Enumeration is included in this report.

The 2017 Provincial General Election was the closest in B.C.'s history. At the end of final count only 0.08% of the total valid votes province-wide separated the top two parties.

Calendar of events

Although the four weeks of the campaign period have the highest visibility, the months and years leading up to a provincial general election are an important period of planning and preparation for Elections BC. Equipment and materials are acquired, staff hired and trained, and logistics and infrastructure streamlined to successfully deliver an inclusive electoral event.

Part of the lead-up to a provincial general election is a provincial enumeration. Between February 14 and April 10, 2017, Elections BC updated the voters list to get British Columbians ready to vote in the 2017 Provincial General Election.

Similarly, the election period doesn't end on General Voting Day. This period continues until the writs of election are returned, usually three weeks later. Further work continues through the remainder of the year as voting books are reviewed, field materials are returned, new registrations are processed, financial reports are submitted and reviewed, and other close-out activities are completed.

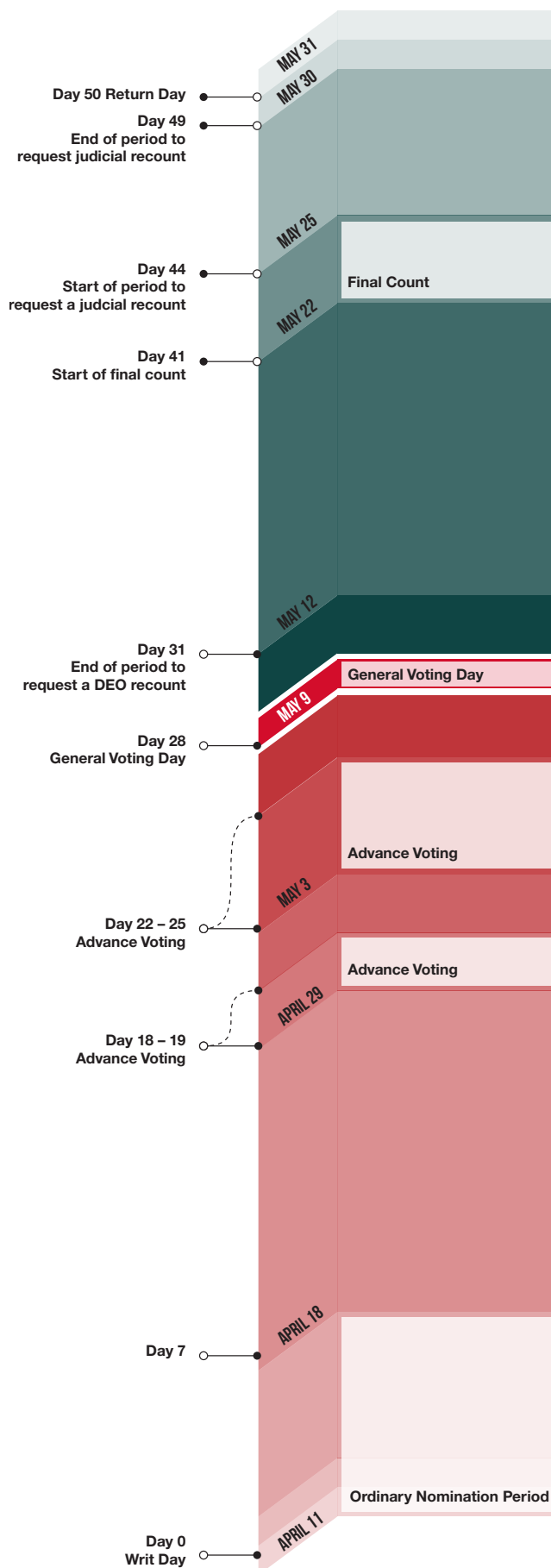

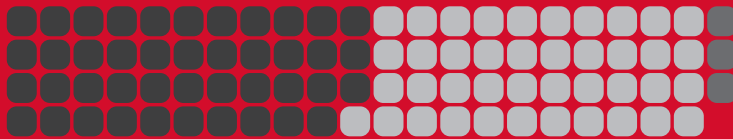

Summary of event preparations by fiscal year

Preparations for the 2017 Provincial General Election, in the form of preliminary budgeting, planning and research, began immediately following the 2013 Provincial General Election. Elections BC used lessons learned reviews with staff and stakeholders to identify the successes from 2013 that could be replicated and to identify where improvements could be made.

The following major event preparations and activities contributed to the successful delivery of the scheduled 2017 Provincial General Election and were undertaken by Elections BC in addition to planning for and delivering eight on-demand events during this time (three by-elections, two recall petitions, two initiative petitions and a plebiscite). Elections BC also assumed the role of administering the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act* shortly before the general local elections held in 2014.

2014-2015

- Reviewed and identified new electoral geography products and services.
- Concluded the competitive process to select Elections BC's external provider of Information Technology (IT) and Geographical Information System (GIS) technical support.
- Initiated a review and update of forms and guides used for all electoral events.
- Supported the BC Electoral Boundaries Commission with technology, expertise and other resources.

2015-2016

- Finalized Elections BC's enumeration strategy and overall plan to register voters throughout B.C. in the lead-up to the 2017 Provincial General Election.
- Initiated the design and development of blended learning programs for district electoral officers and election officials, combining face-to-face instruction with eLearning.



- Began system enhancements to modernize and streamline the voting process, including using voter look-up (VLUP) technology in the voting place and automating the marking of voting books (to indicate which voters voted during the advance voting period).
- Initiated a project to engage with youth through grants to post-secondary student teams working on ideas to boost youth participation in elections.
- Developed an outreach strategy in consultation with youth organizations and other partners to inform a province-wide youth awareness campaign for the 2017 Provincial General Election.
- Analyzed voter participation trends and patterns to improve logistical planning in the field.
- Successfully piloted voter look-up (VLUP) technology and automated marking of voting books in the Vancouver-Mount Pleasant and Coquitlam-Burke Mountain by-elections.
- Conducted a competitive process to select Elections BC's advertising agency of record.
- Implemented new electoral boundaries into Elections BC systems.
- Began redistribution of voting areas throughout the province based on new electoral district boundaries.
- Hired and trained six regional field officers (RFOs) who provide direct support to district electoral officers and their staff.
- Implemented voter look-up technology for vote by mail and voting in the district electoral office to reduce administrative errors and provide reliable end-to-end tracking of voting packages.
- Developed a secure download service to facilitate authorized access to voters list information by candidates and political parties.
- Implemented a redesigned Elections BC website to improve user experience and increase ease of access to electoral event information.
- Developed a series of web-based applications to deliver geography services.
- Automated the creation of geography map products.
- Developed an online "Where to Vote" application for voters to identify their assigned or closest voting place.
- Updated the correspondence tracking system used for interactions with the public and other stakeholders.

District electoral officer (DEO) support and training

- Filled all vacant district electoral officer and deputy district electoral officer positions.
- Launched DEO Desktop, a web-based communications platform and repository of procedures, forms, and other reference information used by RFOs, DEOs, DDEOs and their office staff to administer the general election.
- Launched eLearning modules for district electoral officers and election officials.
- Delivered election readiness training to district electoral officers and deputy district electoral officers blending eLearning with face-to-face workshops.
- Worked with district electoral officers to finalize plans for establishing district electoral offices, recruiting, scheduling and training office staff and election officials, and identifying potential voting places.

2016-2017

Systems

- Developed RegBC, a tablet application for enumerators to register and update voters and track enumeration progress.
- Building on the successful 2016 by-elections pilot, further enhanced voter look-up (VLUP) technology to meet new legislated requirements prescribed by *Election Act* amendments (Bill 20).

Outreach

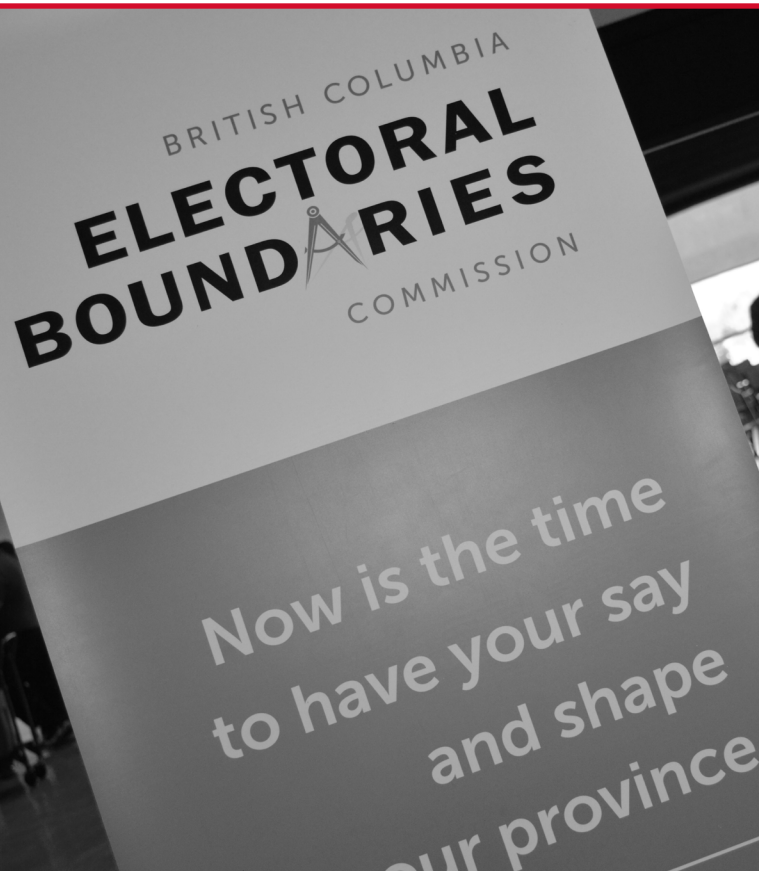
- Established the “Youth at the Booth” program, which worked with school districts to recruit local high school students as election officials.
- Conducted financial agent training sessions around the province.
- Developed and delivered training for election advertising sponsors.
- Liaised with First Nations groups, local health authorities, the Canadian Forces and Coast Guard, correctional facilities, and other groups to promote opportunities to register and vote during the general election.
- Partnered with CIVIX for the delivery of Democracy Bootcamp and Student Vote day to encourage youth participation in the general election.

Enumeration

- Completed a province-wide mailing to all registered voters reminding them to update their voter registration and informing them of changes to the province’s electoral districts.
- Identified community outreach locations and areas suitable for door-to-door enumeration.
- Established 49 enumeration offices, including the installation of communication and information technology.
- Provided information to remote locations by sending pamphlets, posters and other election materials.

Other event preparatory activities

- Finalized event plans for the 2017 Provincial General Election, including Elections BC’s public awareness communications campaign.
- Developed an election official-assisted telephone voting process to serve voters with disabilities who were otherwise unable to vote independently during the general election.
- Implemented new accessibility criteria for voting place selection.
- Deregistered constituency associations associated with previous electoral districts.
- Registered constituency associations under the new electoral district boundaries.
- Recruited and trained additional staff at Elections BC headquarters to support district electoral officers, candidates, political parties and advertising sponsors, and to respond to public inquiries.
- Established the remaining 40 district electoral offices, including the installation of communication and information technology.
- Acquired, packed and distributed election supplies to district electoral offices.
- Contracted with vendors to provide services and equipment to Elections BC headquarters and district electoral offices, including mail and courier services, desktop publishing and printing, learning management systems, telecommunications, computers, multi-function devices, and on-call technical support.



2015 Electoral Boundaries Redistribution

After every second general election an independent and non-partisan electoral boundaries commission is established to propose changes to the area, boundaries and names of the electoral districts of B.C. This ensures that B.C. voters continue to have effective representation as demographics change. Serving on the three-person commission were Justice Thomas Melnick (Chair), Beverley Busson, O.B.C., and Keith Archer, Ph.D.

The 2015 Commission submitted its final proposals to the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly on September 24, 2015. The Legislative Assembly voted to approve the proposals and on November 17, 2015 passed the *Electoral Districts Act*, establishing 87 electoral districts. This increased the number of electoral districts in B.C. from 85. The new electoral district boundaries came into force on April 11, 2017, the day the 2017 Provincial General Election was called.

The 2015 Commission recommended changes to 48 of the existing 85 electoral districts and the addition of new electoral districts in Richmond and Surrey. Boundaries were substantially redrawn in both these areas with the goal of redistributing the population relatively equally and maintaining communities of interest to the extent possible.

New for 2017

Elections BC implemented a significant number of administrative and process changes in the 2017 Enumeration and General Election to improve service and enhance efficiency.

Mobile technology

In preparation for the 2017 Enumeration, Elections BC developed RegBC, an application that allows enumerators to register and update voter information quickly and securely. Tablets installed with RegBC were issued to enumerators throughout the province. Tablets were password protected and locked after a few minutes of inactivity.

In previous enumerations, enumerators carried paper voter registration materials in plastic binders when conducting registration drives and door-to-door activities. By carrying the same information in digital format, tablets offered clear improvements. Binders are heavy, not weather resistant, and not secure. Paper forms require that staff scan completed forms for data entry and processing into the Electoral Information System (EIS). Tablets offer a lightweight, secure, digital solution to these issues. In addition to the practical and security benefits of using tablets, information input to RegBC remained as digital data, representing a best practice in data management.

Technology in the voting place

To meet challenges experienced in the 2009 and 2013 elections, Elections BC initiated a project to use technology in voting places to look up voters, print labels containing voter information for voting documents, and create a voter strike-off record to automate flagging of advance voters in general voting books. When the *Election Act* was amended in 2015 to require Elections BC to provide candidates with lists of voters who voted following each day of advance voting, this project became mandatory.

The proprietary look-up application (VLUP), developed by Elections BC, and associated technology were piloted in the 2016 by-elections in Coquitlam-Burke Mountain and Vancouver-Mount Pleasant. This technology was then used province-wide for the general election in 2017.

Laptops, label printers and bar code scanners were used to automate administrative processes for advance and absentee voting. Election officials used laptops and VLUP to process registered voters and create a strike-off record of who had voted. Election officials could also register voters or update voter information using VLUP. Scanners were used to scan a voter's Where to Vote card to quickly find the voter's information in VLUP, or officials could search for a voter using a drivers licence number, voter name, address or date of birth. Labels containing voter information were then printed and were affixed to advance voting certificates, certification envelopes and voting books.

VLUP also automated decisions and provided guidance to election officials on how to administer voting. For example, it instructed them to issue an ordinary ballot or a write-in ballot to the voter, depending on the type of voting being administered. It would also show the voter's electoral district and voting area based on the voter's residential address. This improved process reduced the number of ballots set aside due to election official error, from 6.9% of absentee ballots in 2013 to 1% of absentee ballots in 2017.

Capturing participation information electronically at advance voting allowed Elections BC to provide candidates with a list of voters who voted after each day of advance voting in each electoral district, and to automatically produce flagged voting books for General Voting Day. These voting books showed who had voted during the advance voting period and at absentee voting opportunities prior to the close of advance voting. In past elections, this work was done manually by district electoral office staff, and was an extremely labour intensive process.

Introducing technology also led to efficiencies during preparations for final count. District electoral office staff scanned the labels affixed to certification envelopes to quickly find voter information in the Voting Results System (VRS). In past elections office staff had to manually enter data to search for a voter in VRS.

Using VLUP reduced the time needed to process voters by 30%.

District electoral officers (DEOs) and election officials reacted favourably to these new tools and the administrative efficiencies they provided. Elections BC considers the introduction of technology a success and will continue to enhance and expand its capabilities in future elections.

Digital mapping tools

iMap is a web-based mapping application built on the Internet Mapping Framework 2.0 (IMF2). The application is supported and hosted by DataBC, and allows users to view map data from sources across the B.C. government and other public sector agencies. Using the iMap application as a base, Elections BC created a custom workflow that allowed DEOs to digitally identify geographic regions where door-to-door enumeration activities would occur within their electoral district. DEOs also used iMap to preview voting area boundaries and propose changes before the boundaries were finalized, and assign voters to their geographic voting area.

The online and collaborative nature of iMap allowed Elections BC headquarters staff to support DEOs with these tasks in real time.

Elections BC used iMap to develop the British Columbia Electoral District Explorer (BC-EDE).



BC-EDE, accessible through the Elections BC website, allowed voters to easily find their electoral district and explore its boundaries.

These tools reduced the need for paper map products and streamlined the communication of electoral geography information between DEOs and Elections BC headquarters staff. Using iMap also allowed Elections BC to publish spatial data in accordance with the provincial government's open data policy and format the data to government standards. Given the increased efficiency, improved service to voters, and privacy and security improvements associated with iMap, Elections BC anticipates using this tool in future elections.

Telephone voting

Elections BC is committed to providing accessible voting opportunities for all eligible voters. A new special voting opportunity, election official-assisted telephone voting, was introduced in the 2017 Provincial General Election. For the first time in a provincial general election in B.C. voters with disabilities could vote by telephone. This option was available to voters who were unable to visit a voting place or vote independently.

A dedicated team at Elections BC headquarters administered telephone voting to more than 1,000 voters. The introduction of telephone voting was a success and Elections BC will offer this option to voters with disabilities in future elections.

Voting area sizes

Electoral districts are subdivided into voting areas. Unlike electoral districts, voting areas are created by Elections BC for administering elections. On General Voting Day, a voting officer and voting clerk administer voting at a voting station for each voting area. Each voting station has a ballot box associated with it. The *Election Act* requires this staffing model, and establishes that voting areas normally represent 400 registered voters.

Following the 2013 Provincial General Election, Elections BC reviewed this administrative model

to look for efficiencies and cost savings. Each successive election saw more registered voters, resulting in more voting areas, more election officials and increased costs. At the same time, changing voter behaviour clearly showed more voters were voting at advance and absentee voting opportunities, and fewer at their assigned voting station on General Voting Day. Between 2005 and 2013, the average number of voters served per voting station decreased from 168 to 121. On General Voting Day, most voting stations were operating at 40% capacity, and in some districts, finding sufficient voting places to accommodate all voting areas was challenging.

Elections BC evaluated voter wait times based on actual "time of day" voting patterns to assess how much voting area sizes could be increased without compromising accessibility. The analysis showed that voting patterns vary across the province based on geography. In densely populated urban electoral districts, voters tend to vote uniformly throughout General Voting Day, whereas in commuter districts, voters are more likely to vote between 5 and 8 p.m., on their way home from school or work.

Using the Chief Electoral Officer's authority under the *Election Act*, voting area sizes were increased on a trial basis in the 2016 by-elections in Coquitlam-Burke Mountain and Vancouver-Mount Pleasant. Coquitlam-Burke Mountain, a commuter district, was redistributed under the new model to a maximum of 600 registered voters per voting area. Vancouver-Mount Pleasant, an urban district, was redistributed to a maximum of 700 registered voters per voting area. This reduced staffing and material costs by 38% in Coquitlam-Burke Mountain and by 49% in Vancouver-Mount Pleasant.

Elections BC found that voting area sizes could be increased substantially without negatively impacting accessibility and service to voters. Based on this success, the new administrative model was adopted for the general election in 2017. In rural areas of the province where the distance to a voting place is a concern, voting

areas were maintained at a maximum of 400 voters to ensure continued accessibility.

The new model led to significant cost savings and did not negatively impact wait times for voters or election official workloads, even with the highest voter turnout in a provincial election in B.C. since 2005. Elections BC estimates that as a result of this change, staffing costs were reduced by around four million dollars when compared to the estimated staffing cost had voting area sizes not been increased.

Election advertising on the Internet

Elections BC issued a new interpretation of election advertising on the Internet in August 2016. Under this interpretation, election messages transmitted over the Internet are election advertising only if they meet the applicable definition of election advertising and have, or would normally have, a placement cost. For example, banner ads, pre-roll videos or ads on Facebook or other social media sites are considered election advertising, because they have placement costs. Messages without placement costs on the Internet, such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and other social media posts, YouTube videos, emails and websites are not election advertising. This change followed an internal review of Elections BC's policies regarding election advertising on the Internet and similar changes made by other election management bodies in Canada, including Elections Canada.

The *Election Act* restricts election advertising on General Voting Day. In past elections, this has meant that social media posts by candidates and political parties were not allowed on General Voting Day. Under the new interpretation, and following legislative change in 2015 that allowed "get-out-the-vote" messages by parties and candidates on General Voting Day, social media posts without a placement cost were permitted on General Voting Day for the 2017 Provincial General Election.

Handmade advertising

Following a decision by the Supreme Court of Canada that individuals engaged in small-scale self-expression are not advertising sponsors under the *Election Act*, Elections BC issued new policies addressing handmade advertising. For the 2017 Provincial General Election, individuals who made their own election advertising materials on a small scale were no longer considered election advertising sponsors under the *Election Act*.



Legislative changes

The *Election Act* gives effect to British Columbians' right to vote in provincial elections by setting the framework for the provincial electoral process. Elections BC conducts provincial elections in accordance with its provisions.

In 2015, Bill 20 introduced a series of amendments to the *Election Act* that affected the conduct of the 2017 Provincial General Election.

General registration and close of the voters list

In previous general elections, the voters list remained open until the seventh day after the writs were issued. For the first time in a general election, general voter registration closed at 11:59:59 p.m. on Writ Day, April 11. The voters list was produced the following day and included any registrations received on Writ Day. The earlier close of the voters list was required to accommodate the earlier advance voting period also introduced for the first time in a general election in 2017. Any voters who did not register by the close of

registration on April 11, and as a result were not on the voters list, could still register when they voted.

Advance voting

Bill 20 extended the advance voting period from four to six days, days 18-19 and 22-25 of the election period. Advance voting days in 2017 were April 29 and 30 and May 3 through May 6. Not all advance voting places were open on every day of the advance voting period, but at least one advance voting place was open in each electoral district on each day of advance voting.

Voters lists with participation

Bill 20 introduced a requirement for Elections BC to provide candidates with lists of voters who voted after each day of advance voting and on General Voting Day.

For advance voting, Elections BC used VLUP to capture voter strike-offs and then provided this data to candidates through a secure download service.

On General Voting Day, election officials recorded participation information on “bingo” sheets which were shared with candidate representatives throughout the day.

During the campaign period, candidates and political parties were also entitled, upon request, to a list of voters that included voter participation information from the most recent election in their respective electoral district. Candidates and parties were required to have an approved privacy policy on file with Elections BC in order to receive lists of voters.

Secure download service

To facilitate the provision of lists of voters who voted after each day of advance voting to candidates, Elections BC developed a secure download service that allowed candidates to access this information digitally. During the 2016 by-elections, this information was provided to candidates on secure USB drives, but this was determined to be inefficient for the larger scale of a provincial general election.

Candidates were provided access credentials upon receiving their certificate of candidacy that allowed them to log in to the secure download service and access the participation information for their electoral district after each day of advance voting. The secure download service ensured that candidates were privately and securely provided with voter participation information to support their campaigning ahead of General Voting Day.

60-day pre-campaign period eliminated

In previous general elections, expenses related to election advertising or campaigning conducted by or on behalf of a candidate, constituency association, or registered political party incurred during a 60-day pre-campaign period were considered election expenses. Bill 20 eliminated the 60-day pre-campaign period, so election expenses incurred before Writ Day were not subject to election expenses limits.

Fundraising communications expenses not subject to limits

Expenses related to fundraising communications were added to the list of election expenses under section 203 of the *Election Act* that are not subject to election expenses limits.

Online get-out-the-vote messages permitted on General Voting Day

Section 233 of the *Election Act*, which specifies exclusions to the general prohibition against election advertising on General Voting Day, was amended to add messages transmitted to the public on the Internet for the sole purpose of encouraging voters to vote. These messages were permitted on General Voting Day for the 2017 election.

Ordinary nominations

In previous elections, the ordinary nomination period began when the election was called and ended on day 10 at 1 p.m. (Pacific time). Bill 20 amended the *Election Act* so that the ordinary nomination period ended at 1 p.m. (Pacific time) on day 7. This change was due to the earlier start of advance voting, also introduced through Bill 20, which necessitated an earlier close of nominations to allow sufficient time to print ordinary ballots.

Vouching

For the 2017 election, all individuals vouching for a voter were required to show identification. Family members and those with personal care authority were previously excluded from this requirement.

Solemn declarations

Additional legislative changes were introduced when the *Miscellaneous Statutes (Signed Statement) Amendment Act* received Royal Assent on March 4, 2016. This Act amended several sections of the *Election Act* that required solemn declarations by replacing the requirement with a signed statement.

2017 Enumeration

In February and March, Elections BC conducted an enumeration to update the voters list to prepare for the 2017 Provincial General Election. An accurate voters list is essential for an inclusive, accessible and fair general election, and Elections BC recognizes that voters who are not registered at their current residential address face greater administrative barriers to voting. An accurate list increases the speed at which voters can be processed, so improving the quality of the voters list is part of the voter-centric model of election administration practiced by Elections BC. The voters list is also provided to candidates and political parties who use it to contact voters.

Registered voters receive personalized Where to Vote cards during an election to tell them where and when they can vote. The cards are also used by election officials to administer voting quickly and efficiently. Voters who are not registered at their current address will not receive a personalized Where to Vote card and must register or update their voter information when they vote.

While Elections BC maintains a high-quality voters list, the quality is not universally high across all electoral districts and demographics. The 2017 Enumeration sought to address this by conducting voter registration activities that would reach all eligible voters in B.C. while also targeting specific demographic and geographic groups. During the enumeration period, Elections BC staff visited locations where eligible voters are less likely to be registered, such as new developments and high mobility areas, as well as facilities that serve the homeless, post-secondary institutions, ethnic communities and First Nations communities.

Voters list quality is determined using the following measures:

Table 3: Voters list quality measures

Measurement	Definition
Coverage	The percentage of eligible voters on the voters list. Also called completeness.
Currency	The percentage of voters on the voters list who are registered at the correct residential address.
Net currency	The percentage of eligible voters registered at the correct residential address.

Elections BC had three main goals for the 2017 Enumeration:

- To achieve a level of voters list quality equal to or better than that achieved at the close of general registration prior to the 2013 Provincial General Election.
 - At least 95% coverage and 93% currency, for a net currency of 88% province-wide.
 - At least 65% coverage for voters 18 to 24 years of age.
 - At least 85% coverage in all regions of the province.
- To determine the effectiveness of different targeted enumeration approaches, as measured through the number of updates and new registrations attributable to each approach.
- To use resources effectively by conducting targeted voter registration activities in all electoral districts in a manner that addressed the unique characteristics of each district.



Strategies and methods

Building on the successful strategy of the 2013 Enumeration, district electoral officers (DEOs) and deputy district electoral officers (DDEOs) developed a customized enumeration plan for their electoral district. This leveraged the experience and local knowledge of DEOs and DDEOs, and established voter registration strategies and techniques that fit the unique characteristics and challenges of each electoral district.


As background, DEOs and DDEOs developed an electoral district profile that listed all major commercial centres, ethnic communities, First Nations communities and education institutions in their district, as well as areas of high mobility and new residential growth. District profiles were used to develop an electoral district enumeration plan that outlined the number and types of enumeration activities to be conducted in communities throughout the district. The final enumeration plan for each electoral district was tailored to the district's unique needs, though built on the same principles and methods across the province.

On March 1, 2017, 49 district electoral offices were established across the province to manage the conduct of enumeration activities.

Field activities

Between March 8 and March 25, Elections BC conducted a series of on-the-ground enumeration activities targeted to areas of the province and voter groups characterized by lower than average registration rates. DEOs employed teams of enumerators in each electoral district to conduct various field registration activities, including door-to-door enumeration, registration drives, site-based voting area (SVA) enumeration, and community outreach and engagement activities. Province-wide, 748 enumerators were hired to conduct registration activities in the field.

Areas suitable for door-to-door enumeration were identified in the district's enumeration plan. These included high-mobility areas, short term accommodations and areas of new development, such as new building complexes or subdivisions. A door-to-door target analysis study provided by BC Stats outlining areas of high mobility helped DEOs refine their enumeration plans. Residents in these areas were less likely to be registered at their current address.



Working in pairs, teams of enumerators went door-to-door in the designated areas, updating the voters list using the RegBC tablet application. If no one was available at an address, enumerators left a “Sorry we missed you” card and information brochure directing residents to other registration opportunities. Across the province, over 170,000 residences were visited by door-to-door enumerators.

In areas where door-to-door enumeration was not practical, DEOs identified the best locations in their electoral district to conduct registration drives. Registration drives also presented an opportunity for Elections BC to gain a visible presence in the community and take voter registration services to voters. Registration drives were held in public places like high-rise apartment and condo lobbies, shopping centres, recreation facilities and libraries. Enumerators at registration drives used tablets loaded with the RegBC application to register voters and update voter information efficiently and securely.

Enumerators also provided registration opportunities to residents of site-based voting areas (SVAs). SVAs are established in locations such as long-term care or other facilities where voters are permanent residents, and where voters would be significantly challenged to attend other regular voting opportunities.

Enumerators visited each SVA to ensure that all resident eligible voters had an opportunity to register or update their voter registration. On General Voting Day, mobile voting teams visited each SVA to conduct voting. Together, SVA enumeration and mobile voting allow voters who may otherwise be unable to vote to cast their ballot. Approximately 18,000 registrations and updates at SVAs were conducted during the 2017 Enumeration.

Community outreach activities were conducted to engage groups typically under-represented on the voters list. DEOs reached out to First Nations communities and other ethnic, cultural and

demographic groups in the electoral district that they felt could benefit from a community outreach event.

Outreach events were tailored to meet the needs of each target community, and offered registration opportunities and highlighted voting and employment opportunities related to the general election. DEOs worked closely with community leaders and facility administrators to ensure that these events were well promoted. DEOs and DDEOs typically played a more central role in these activities in order to establish and strengthen relationships between Elections BC and the community.

More information about Elections BC's youth and community outreach programs can be found in section 4 of this report.



Public information and communications

Enumerators, DEOs and DDEOs were supported in the field by Elections BC headquarters staff in Victoria. In addition to planning, training and developing technology in preparation for the 2017 Enumeration, headquarters staff conducted a public awareness campaign and operated a call centre during the enumeration period.

Registration notice

A key piece of the enumeration public awareness campaign was the voter registration notice. Notices were sent to two million residential addresses across the province, listing voters registered at the address and urging eligible voters to register or update their information if needed by the close of general voter registration on April 11. The notices asked recipients to review the personal information included in the notice for accuracy and take action if needed. Three versions of the notice were distributed.

The majority of notices were sent to mailing addresses in B.C. where at least one voter was registered. This notice listed the voters registered at the address and instructed them to register or update online or by phone if any registration information was incorrect or incomplete.

A second version of the notice was sent to residential addresses with no registered voters. These notices stated that there were no registered voters at the address and instructed recipients to register online or by phone, provided they met the eligibility requirements.

The third version of the notice was sent to non-civic addresses with no registered voters. Non-civic addresses include post-office boxes and general delivery mailboxes. This notice encouraged recipients who were eligible voters to take action to ensure their voter registration was up to date.

All notices were mailed between February 14 and March 8. Elections BC used Canada Post's Point-of-Call database to target only valid mailing addresses, avoiding the cost of sending enumeration notices to addresses where mail could not be delivered.

Advertising

Elections BC developed a comprehensive communications strategy to increase public awareness and engage voters in the lead-up to the 2017 Provincial General Election. During the enumeration period, Elections BC incorporated digital, radio, print and television advertising with a proactive social media campaign.

The enumeration public awareness campaign, which ran from February 14 to March 31, promoted voter registration and supported Elections BC's field activities and outreach. The campaign, themed "I Register", encouraged eligible voters to register online or by phone before the close of general registration on April 11. Television, radio and print advertising featured British Columbians of diverse backgrounds. One of B.C.'s best-known sports figures, Trevor Linden, was also featured in the ads. To target young people and other groups less likely to register and vote, printed ads were posted on Skytrain platforms, in buses province-wide, and in restaurants and bars.

Website

During the enumeration, the Elections BC website highlighted relevant information about the new electoral district boundaries, planned registration activities taking place in communities throughout B.C., and voter eligibility criteria.

Before the voters list closed on Writ Day, eligible voters could register or update their voter information online using the Online Voter Registration system (OVR). Links to OVR were featured prominently throughout Elections BC's website, public awareness advertisements and social media posts. Per the requirements of the *Election Act*, OVR was unavailable after April 11 and eligible voters who needed to register or update were directed to do so when they voted.

Social media

Social media was a major component of the public awareness campaign during the enumeration. Elections BC shared images and videos consistent with the traditional media campaign on Facebook, Twitter and YouTube. A first for an electoral management body in Canada, Elections BC also expanded its social media presence to include Instagram.

The social media campaign was integrated with Elections BC's traditional registration activities. Elections BC used social media to promote voter registration online and by phone using the hashtags #IRegister and #GetOnTheListBC, generating 5.6 million impressions and reaching

1.7 million British Columbians on Twitter alone. Social media and other online advertising drove over 20,000 trackable clicks to OVR.

One new initiative was the use of the "button board" at campus-based registration drives. People were invited to take an "I Register" button from the board, revealing the campaign message and hashtag #GetOnTheListBC. A time-lapse video was taken of the button board and shared on social media.

During the enumeration period, Elections BC's social media followers grew by 79% on Facebook and 20% on Twitter.

Contact centre

To handle the increased call volume during the enumeration period, Elections BC established a contact centre at its headquarters in Victoria. Contact centre staff processed voter registrations and updates and fielded questions and comments from the public. During the enumeration period, the contact centre performed 72,869 voter record transactions, resulting in 34,882 new registrations and updates. The contact centre remained open through the election period until shortly after General Voting Day.

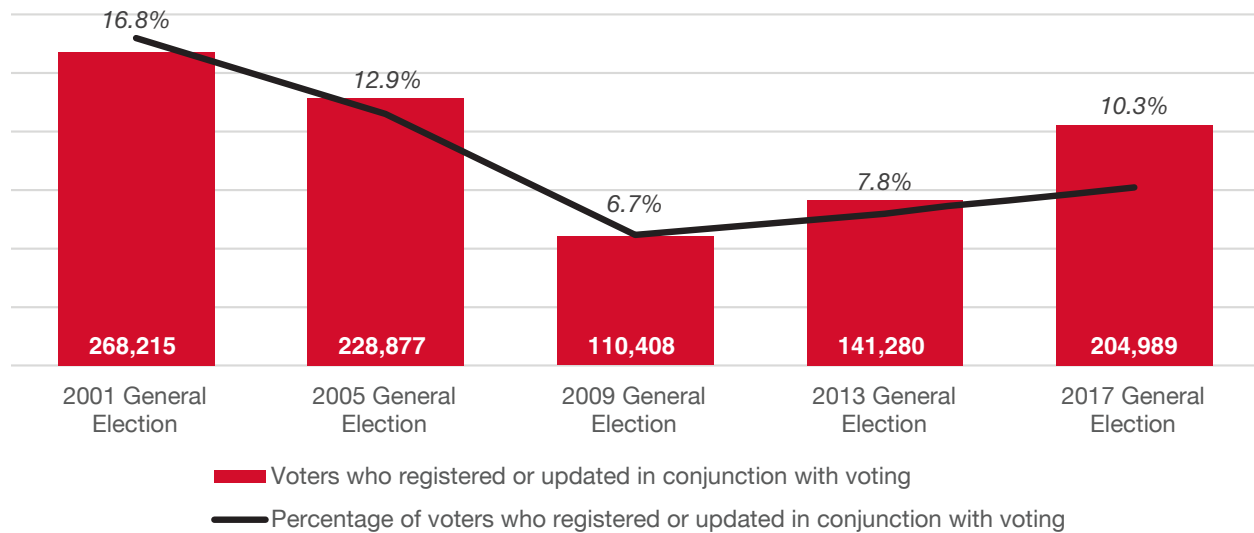

Registration in conjunction with voting

After the close of the voters list on April 11, voter registration was only available in conjunction with voting. Voters who wished to register in conjunction with voting were required to prove their identity and residential address to register and vote.

There were 204,989 registrations and updates in conjunction with voting, resulting in 89,656 new registrations and 115,333 updates. There were an additional 8,714 “just in case” registrations in conjunction with voting, where the transaction resulted in no changes to a voter record. At the close of voting on General Voting Day, there were 3,246,647 registered voters on the voters list.

Outcomes

During the enumeration period, more than 135,000 voters list transactions resulted from enumeration activities. An additional 240,000 voters list transactions were processed through the call center, by the Online Voter Registration (OVR) system, or were unrelated to the enumeration and resulted from operational activities during this period, such as updates from the National Register of Electors, ICBC and Vital Statistics.

Assessing enumeration results

Overall coverage, currency and net currency

Elections BC contracted BC Stats to conduct the 2017 Voters List Quality Study to measure the quality of the voters list at three points: before the start of the enumeration (January 19, 2017), after the close of general registration (April 11, 2017), and on General Voting Day (May 9, 2017). BC Stats conducted a comprehensive assessment of the currency of the list as of May 9, 2017 by combining information from the enumeration and election with information from a survey of registered voters. An estimate of currency at the start of the enumeration and at the close of general registration was produced by analyzing additions, deletions and changes to records on the voters list that took place between January 19 and April 11, and between April 11 and May 9.

To calculate coverage, BC Stats estimated the number of eligible voters in each electoral district by using population counts collected during the 2011 Census and administrative and survey data collected in conjunction with the 2016 Census. More information on the methods used to calculate coverage is included in the report on the 2017 Voters List Quality Study from BC Stats, scheduled to be published in spring 2018.

Following the pattern seen in 2013, voters list coverage decreased during the enumeration, as the 45,255 registrations received between January 19 and April 11 were outpaced by 47,282 removals. While currency and net currency increased through the 2017 Enumeration, the levels of coverage, currency and net currency at the close of general registration fell short of the levels achieved in 2013.

A significant factor in the reduced level of voters list quality from 2013 was a lower quality list at the beginning of the enumeration period. The seven-point reduction in net currency between the start of the 2013 Enumeration and the start of the 2017 Enumeration occurred despite more than two million new registrations, updates and removals between the end of the 2013 Provincial General Election and the start of the 2017 Enumeration. The 2017 Enumeration achieved greater quality improvements to currency and net currency than in the 2013 Enumeration, but the degree of list quality improvement was not enough to produce a better end result. Although the same level of list quality achieved in 2013 was not reached by the close of general voter registration in 2017, registration in conjunction with voting raised list quality to the pre-election target level.

Coverage by region

Coverage levels in each region of the province were also estimated in the 2017 Voters List Quality Study. Elections BC's goal was to achieve at least 85% coverage in every region of the province by the close of general registration on April 11, which was achieved in all regions. The lowest coverage level was in the North, at 85%.

Youth coverage

Elections BC's goal of achieving coverage of 65% of voters aged 18-24 at the close of general registration was not achieved. The estimated coverage as of April 11 of voters aged 18-24, based on voter data and BC Stats estimates, was 58%. The coverage of 18-24 year-olds rose to 68% at the close of voting on May 9, 2017, due to voters who registered in conjunction with voting.

Determining the effectiveness of targeted enumeration approaches

One goal of the 2017 Enumeration was to determine the effectiveness of different targeted enumeration approaches, as measured through the number of updates and new registrations attributable to each approach. A benefit of using the RegBC tablet application to track enumeration activities is that Elections BC has rich operational data about the effectiveness of each activity to help plan future activities.

Each type of voters list transaction has a different effect on list quality. Registrations improve both coverage and currency by adding new voters to the list at their current address. Removals are applied to records of voters who no longer live at an address or who have died, improving currency by removing non-current voters from the list, while also reducing coverage. Updates are applied to voters whose name or address have changed. Updates improve currency by moving voters from a non-current address to a current address and have no effect on coverage. Voter record confirmations are applied to indicate that a record is correct as-is. These transactions are administratively useful, but they do not improve the coverage or currency of the voters list.

Door-to-door enumeration accounted for nearly 60% of enumeration activities and a similar proportion of overall field enumeration transactions, but around 75% of these transactions were confirmations that had no effect on list quality. The biggest challenge reported by enumerators and evident in tracking data was that at approximately 75% of homes visited by enumerators, doors went unanswered. While door-to-door activities were more effective in some areas than others, there was little variation in door-answer rates at different times of day.

Outreach visits to post-secondary institutions, First Nation communities, homeless service facilities and ethnic communities represented a small but important component of registration activities. These activities brought registration opportunities to communities that experience barriers to accessing other registration channels.

Registration drives and outreach visits accounted for 29% of enumeration activities and 24% of new registrations and updates. Building on enumerator experiences in 2013, higher-traffic locations were targeted for registration drives, and proactive engagement with voters was emphasized during enumerator training in 2017, resulting in more transactions at registration drives and outreach visits than in 2013.

Enumeration in site-based voting areas (SVAs) was highly effective. Most SVAs are residential care facilities with a higher density of residents than typical door-to-door routes, more staff assistance available than at most outreach visits, and higher turnover than at most residences. SVA enumeration accounted for only 12% of enumeration activities, but over 45% of new registrations and updates. Because of the importance of an up-to-date voters list in administering mobile voting procedures to SVA residents, SVA enumeration continues to be a crucial element of administering elections in B.C.

Making effective use of resources in all electoral districts

One of Elections BC's goals for the 2017 Enumeration was to make effective use of resources by conducting targeted voter registration activities in all electoral districts in a manner that addressed the unique characteristics of each district. The planning exercises and electoral district profiles completed by DEOs and DDEOs ahead of the enumeration period enabled Elections BC to achieve this goal and contributed to the success of the 2017 Enumeration.

Public information and communications

For the 2017 Provincial General Election, Elections BC developed a comprehensive and integrated communications strategy to engage voters and other stakeholders in the electoral process.

In addition to messages about voter registration and election day, the campaign focused on the many voting opportunities available to voters in B.C. and the key message that voters can vote at any voting opportunity in the province. Elections BC took extra steps to reach youth, Aboriginal people, people with disabilities, new Canadians and others who are less likely to register and vote.

The strategy was built on research and data from the 2013 Provincial General Election, historical information, and information gathered through outreach efforts. It encompassed a variety of activities, including:

- advertising in newspapers, on television, on radio, online and in public places (through posters in restaurants and bars and on public transit);
- conducting a comprehensive social and digital media campaign;
- mailing Where to Vote cards;
- providing an informational Voter's Guide to the public through district electoral offices, partner organizations, and the Elections BC website;
- implementing a comprehensive media relations strategy;
- operating a 1-800 contact centre for voter inquiries; and
- implementing a strategic outreach program.

Advertising

In accordance with the *Election Act*, Elections BC placed two statutory advertisements in newspapers across the province. The first notice included information about the candidate nomination process and the dates and hours for general and advance voting. The second provided information about candidates, when and where to vote, and voter identification requirements.

The general election public awareness campaign ran from April 12 to May 8, and continued the look and feel of the "I Register" enumeration campaign. The theme of the campaign was "I Vote". Like the enumeration campaign, it featured Trevor Linden and a diverse group of individuals representing all British Columbians.

Website

In preparation for the 2017 Provincial General Election, the Elections BC website was relaunched on February 10, 2017 with a new design, updated content and enhanced support for mobile devices. The website continued to be a primary resource for voters, the media and other audiences seeking information about the election.

Website traffic was significantly higher for this election than in 2013. The website received 943,991 visits during the election period (an average of 33,714 per day), with 205,147 visits on General Voting Day. Forty-three percent of visitors to the Elections BC website accessed the site using mobile devices, an increase of 23% over 2013.

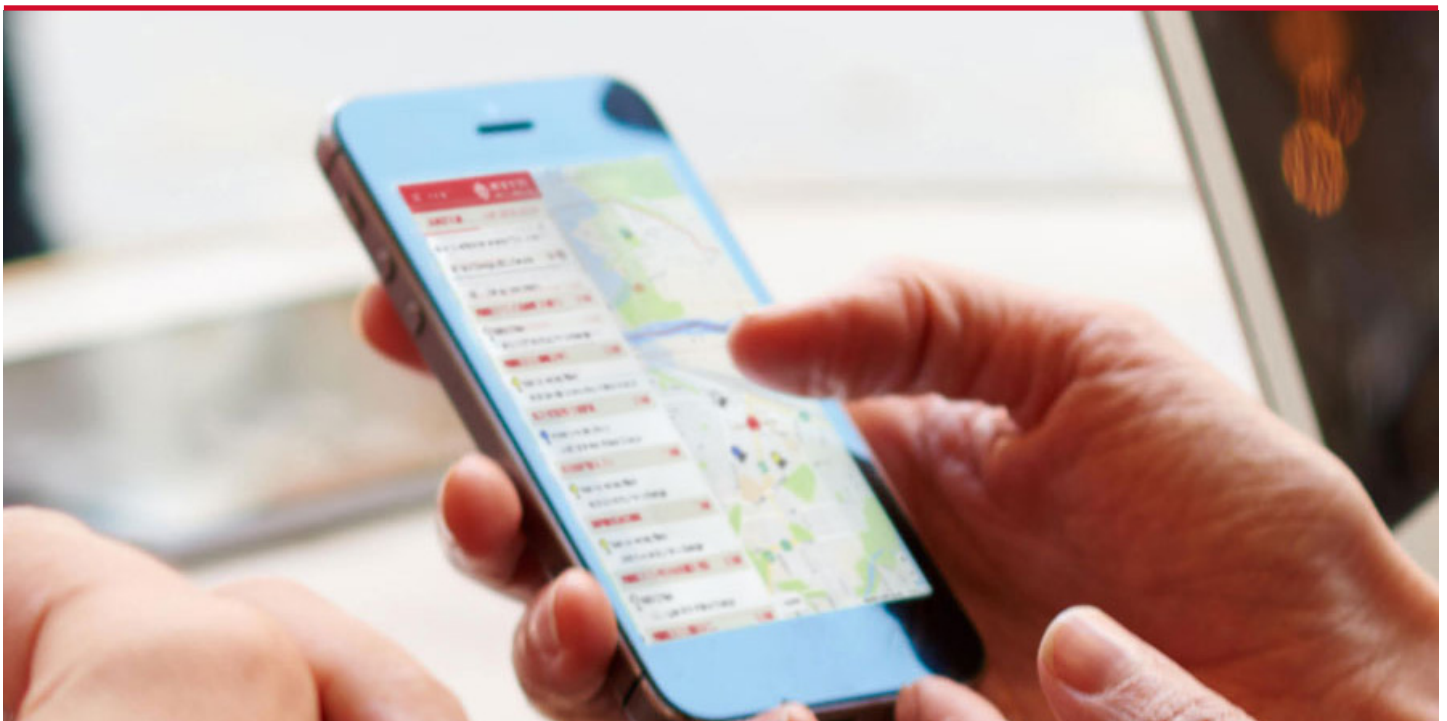

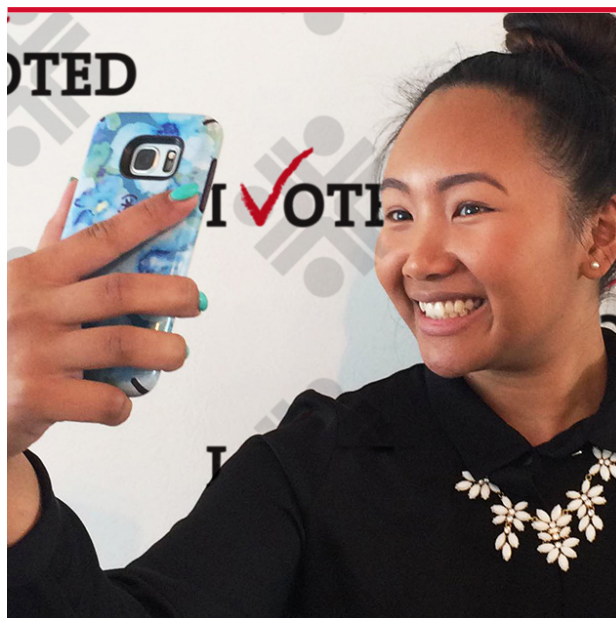

A dedicated general election event page answered the most frequently asked questions from voters, and provided key event information, such as candidate lists and district electoral office contact information.

The Elections BC website also provided a Where to Vote application that allowed users to enter their address to find their assigned voting place. Users could also find voting places near them based on their location, and the application would provide directions. Voting places, as well as district electoral offices and electoral boundaries, were displayed on a Google Map.

On election night, results were reported online, starting when polls closed at 8 p.m. (Pacific time). Results were updated every three minutes as counting progressed, and were available by candidate or by electoral district.





Social Media

During the election period, Elections BC's social media channels supported the "I Vote" messaging of the larger public awareness campaign. Elections BC incorporated the existing hashtags #bcelxn17 and #bcelxn2017 into its social media posts. These hashtags, developed organically, were used by the majority of the general public and political participants engaging in the general election conversation on social media. Elections BC also promoted the hashtag #IVoteBC to encourage voter participation.

Elections BC incorporated #IVoteBC into the "selfie poster" project. For the first time in a provincial election in B.C., posters were available at voting places for voters to use as a background to take a voting day selfie. Voters could share their photos via social media with the campaign hashtag #IVoteBC. Posters were put up in each voting place in an area that did not affect privacy or impede the flow of people in and out of the voting place.

Building on the popularity of the "I Voted" stickers given to voters during the 2013 Provincial General Election, Elections BC created "First Time Voter" stickers for youth, new Canadians or anyone else who voted for the first time in 2017. "Future Voter" stickers were also given to children at voting places to encourage voters to bring their families. Voters sharing images of their "I Voted", "First Time Voter" and "Future Voter" stickers was popular on social media.

Elections BC received a significant number of messages and questions via social media during both the enumeration and general election periods. The use of paid social posts helped increase voter engagement with Elections BC's social media channels, since users did not have to be following Elections BC's social accounts for a promoted post to appear in their newsfeed.

By responding to inquiries via social media, Elections BC was able to direct users to the relevant information on its website and answer questions quickly. Recognizing that many voters find social media more timely and accessible than contacting Elections BC by phone, staff endeavoured to answer questions received via social media promptly.

Elections BC's social media audience continued to grow throughout the election period. Overall, Elections BC's social channels grew by 98% through the enumeration and general election.

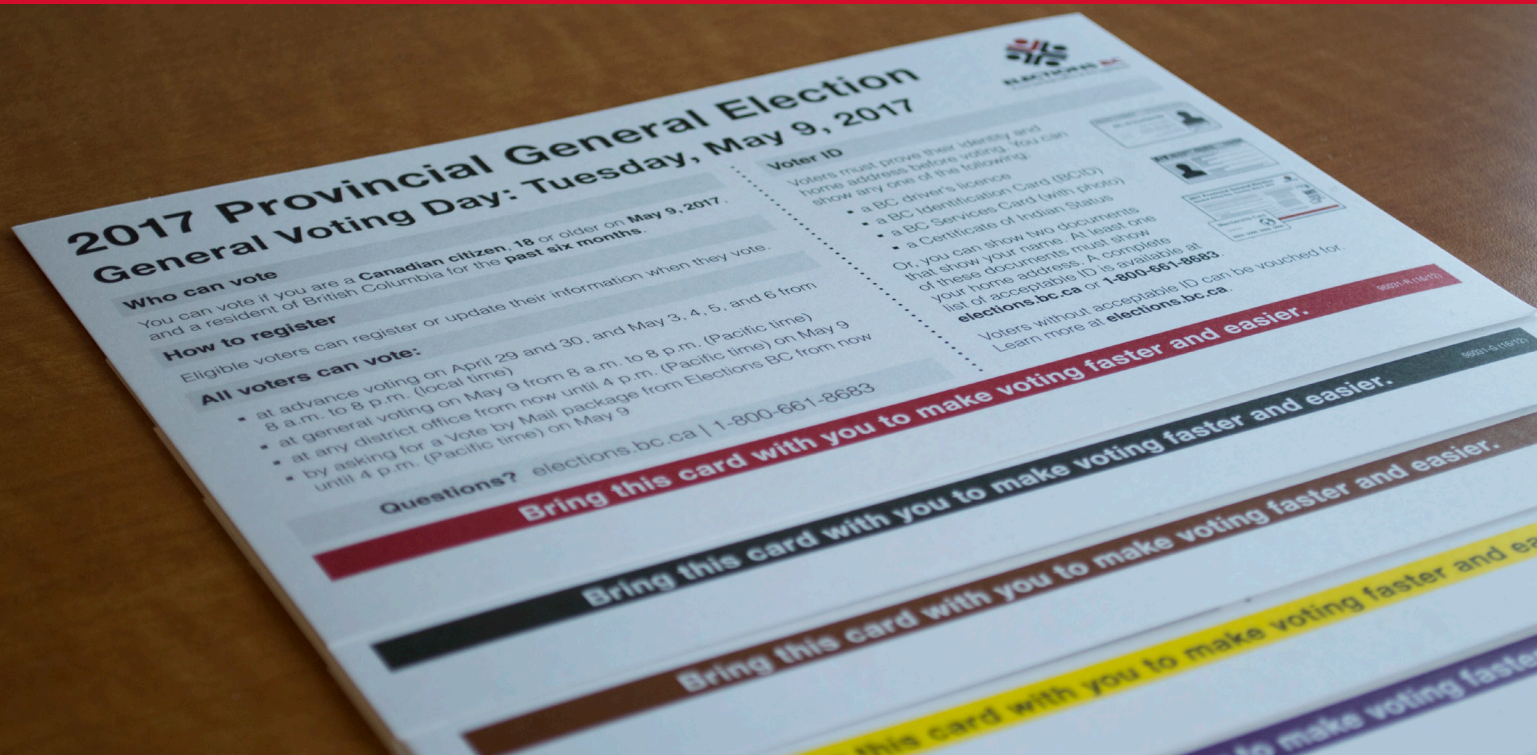
Elections BC also partnered with local sites Daily Hive Vancouver, Miss 604 and Vancouver is Awesome to access their existing audiences and to target youth. Together, these influencers reach over one million people.

Elections BC worked closely with each site to develop videos and articles tailored to their audience. Content was shared on social media by the publisher and Elections BC. Sponsored articles generated more than 22,000 page views, and videos were viewed more than 200,000 times.

Where to Vote card

As in previous years, the Where to Vote card remained a key feature of the general election public awareness campaign. To ensure voters were aware of the voting opportunities in their community, a Where to Vote card was mailed to every registered voter in B.C. ahead of the advance voting period. Each registered voter's card showed the dates and locations for advance voting in their electoral district, the voter's assigned general voting place, and information about eligibility requirements and acceptable voter identification. Over three million cards were sent to registered voters throughout B.C.

New for this election, Where to Vote cards were colour-coded by electoral district, enabling election officials to quickly determine if a voter was voting outside of their district (and should vote through the absentee voting process). Also new for this election, colourless "unaddressed cards" were mailed to addresses with no registered voters. These cards reached out to unregistered eligible voters with information about eligibility requirements, the option for voters to register when they vote, and voting opportunities.



Voter's Guide

Elections BC produced a Voter's Guide containing information about voting dates and times, voter eligibility requirements, and acceptable voter identification. The Voter's Guide also included basic information about the electoral process, a "what to expect when you vote" infographic, and a timeline of key dates in the election period.






The design of the Voter's Guide matched the look and feel of the overall advertising campaign. Copies of the Voter's Guide were available at district electoral offices and through partner organizations. Digital copies of the Voter's Guide translated into 16 languages were available on the Elections BC website.

News releases and media advisories

Throughout the election period, Elections BC released relevant information and statements to the public through news releases and media advisories. These were released at key times throughout the campaign to inform voters of important dates and other essential information.

Four news releases and seven media advisories were distributed during the election period.

Contact centre

The contact centre was opened during the enumeration period to support voter registration and remained open during the election to provide information and respond to questions from the public. Three contact centre supervisors and 24 contact centre operators staffed the contact centre between February 14 and May 11. Training took place in January and February before the contact centre opened on February 14. Operators were available weekdays from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., with extended hours on Easter Monday, April 17 (9 a.m. to 5 p.m.), Sunday, May 7 (10 a.m. to 4 p.m.), during the advance voting period (7 a.m. to 9 p.m.), and on General Voting Day (7 a.m. to 9 p.m.).

In total, the contact centre received 130,371 calls, peaking on General Voting Day with 5,924 calls.

Outreach

Elections BC engaged with organizations that provide services to individuals with barriers to electoral participation, including youth (18-24), post-secondary students, Aboriginal people, new Canadians, people with disabilities and people who are homeless. Their existing networks were used to increase awareness of voting processes and opportunities and provide information about employment opportunities.

The caller was an official from immigration services. The call came in on General Voting Day at approximately noon following a citizenship ceremony. The official asked if these new Canadians could vote.

I was proud to inform the official of the eligibility requirements and to instruct the official to direct the new Canadians to a voting station to register and to receive a ballot to vote!

Activities and partnerships included:

The Westcoast Reader

The Westcoast Reader is a four page, monthly newspaper-style learning resource for beginning readers of English, including new Canadians. The goals of the Westcoast Reader are to help learners improve their reading ability and to help newcomers increase their understanding of the culture and environment in Canada. Elections BC worked in conjunction with the newspaper's editors to create a four page supplement to the April edition targeted to readers at a beginner reading level.

The supplement included information about what voters were voting for, voting opportunities, accessibility in the voting place, eligibility criteria and how to find your electoral district. A step-by-step illustration of what to expect in the voting place was also featured, as well as statistics highlighting the largest and smallest electoral districts in the province and important dates in B.C.'s electoral history.

More than 5,000 copies of The Westcoast Reader were distributed to organizations and businesses throughout B.C.

Check Your Head

Elections BC partnered with Check Your Head, a not-for-profit organization based in Vancouver that provides education, resources, training, and support to youth to help them live as engaged, independent, and active citizens. This youth-driven organization promoted voter registration, encouraged youth to vote, and shared information about participating in the election and issues in a non-partisan way.

Check Your Head activities included assisting over 50 youth to register to vote; organizing a field trip for youth to attend two all-candidate debates; sharing information about the provincial general election via social media to over 2,500 followers, and; organizing a youth voter engagement event called Get Out the Vote, which engaged at least 35 youth in conversation about the provincial general election and voting process.

Samara Canada

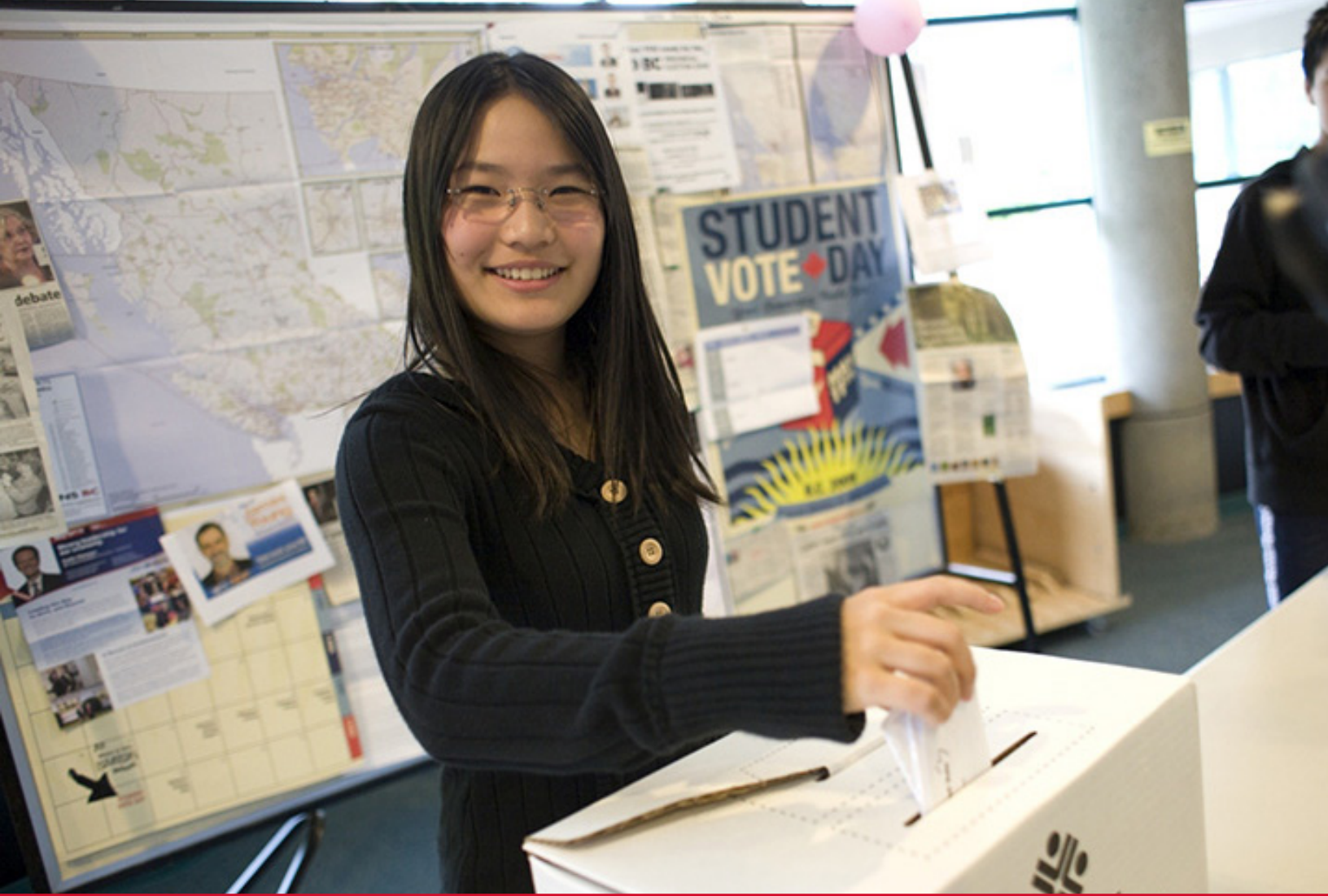
Elections BC partnered with the national charity, Samara Canada, to support their Vote PopUp program. Vote PopUp simulates the voting experience to demystify the voting process for first-time and infrequent voters.

In preparation for the 2017 Provincial General Election, Samara Canada created a Vote PopUp pilot project in Metro Vancouver. During the pilot project, volunteers and staff members of community-based organizations and Samara Canada hosted Vote PopUp sessions in a variety of locations, including food banks, student unions, classrooms, public libraries, and Neighbourhood Houses. Participants included youth not enrolled in school, Canadian newcomers, adults with disabilities, and other members of the public. During the Vote PopUp pilot project, 45 community-based organizations conducted a total of 140 Vote PopUp sessions and 4,812 individuals participated.

Speaking Engagements

Chief Electoral Officer Keith Archer and other Elections BC representatives conducted 15 speaking engagements as part of the strategic outreach program. They presented to a variety of organizations and individuals throughout the province between October 2016 and April 2017 to share information about Elections BC and the 2017 Provincial General Election, including details about how to register to vote, voter eligibility requirements, voting opportunities, and identification requirements. Attendees included First Nation chiefs and delegates, people who serve individuals with disabilities, high school and post-secondary students, new Canadian citizens, and other members of the public.

Overall, speaking engagements had higher attendance when they were conducted in conjunction with an event or meeting that was already planned. For this reason, in the future Elections BC will focus on speaking engagements associated with established conferences and gatherings.



CIVIX

Since 2005, Elections BC has partnered with CIVIX, a national charity that provides experiential learning opportunities that help young Canadians become informed and engaged citizens. In 2017, Elections BC funded two of CIVIX's programs: Student Vote and Democracy Bootcamp.

Student Vote is a parallel election for students under the voting age that helps teach them about government and the electoral process. CIVIX coordinates a Student Vote Day where students cast ballots for the official local candidate. 173,703 students participated in Student Vote Day on May 8, 2017. In total, 1,220 schools registered to participate in the Student Vote program, an increase over the 766 schools and 100,000 students who registered for the Student Vote program for the 2013 Provincial General Election.

Democracy Bootcamp is a two-day professional development conference for elementary and high school teachers that is designed to improve teachers' political interest and knowledge, increase their commitment to civic education, and increase their instructional capacity to teach students about democracy and citizenship. In February 2017, 166 teachers from throughout the province attended this event.

Looking forward, Elections BC plans to increase its in-house outreach and public education capacity to focus on creating a strategy that supports civic education and long-term partnerships.

Election officials and office staff

District electoral officers, deputy district electoral officers and regional field officers

A district electoral officer (DEO) is appointed by the Chief Electoral Officer to conduct electoral events in their assigned electoral district. Assisted by one or more deputy district electoral officers (DDEOs), DEOs are responsible for hiring, scheduling and training election officials, overseeing voting and ballot counting and reporting results. By ensuring fair and impartial election administration in their electoral district, DEOs play a key role in the provincial electoral process.

87 DEOs and 90 DDEOs were appointed for the 2017 Provincial General Election. Due to the large geographical areas of the Peace River North and Powell River-Sunshine Coast electoral districts, two district electoral offices per district were needed to ensure accessibility. In these districts, a second DDEO was appointed to manage the additional office. A second DDEO was also appointed in Surrey-White Rock to provide additional support.

Elections BC delivered a series of training workshops to ensure that DEOs and DDEOs were prepared. Held in June 2016, September 2016 and February 2017, the workshops featured modular training sessions delivered in-person by Elections BC subject matter experts. A variety of educational strategies were employed, including visual presentations, practical exercises and numerous question-and-answer opportunities. DEOs and DDEOs were grouped into six regions, and each region attended training sessions together. The smaller region-based groups enabled DEOs and DDEOs to discuss common issues and challenges in electoral administration specific to their region.

Prior to each training workshop, DEOs and DDEOs completed online eLearning modules to prepare and make connections to related

learning. DEOs and DDEOs were also provided laptops, smart phones, and access to the DEO Desktop website. This online resource was a “one stop shop” for DEOs and allowed Elections BC headquarters staff to provide support in real time. The paper DEO manual used in past elections was converted to digital format and made available on DEO Desktop. DEOs and DDEOs were able to securely access this information anywhere using a laptop or mobile device. This blended learning approach allowed DEOs and DDEOs to focus on applying content or practicing skills at the in-person training opportunities, and reinforced deeper learning over a longer period of time.

In 2013, the role of Regional Field Officer (RFO) was created as an additional level of support, providing a link between DEOs, DDEOs and Elections BC headquarters staff. In 2017, six RFOs, each with expert knowledge of their region and its unique challenges, offered mentoring, leadership, troubleshooting, quality enhancement and support during the election period. The RFOs also provided Elections BC with qualitative insight into the conduct of the election at the local level and helped Elections BC assess performance of DEOs and DDEOs.

District electoral offices and staff

A district electoral office was established in every electoral district in the province. In Peace River North and Powell River-Sunshine Coast, an additional office was opened to ensure accessibility for voters and candidates. All 89 offices opened to the public on April 10, closed on May 10, and were vacated by May 31.

Recruitment for district electoral office staff began in November 2016 and continued through April 2017. DEOs hired 1,255 employees to provide administrative support, recruit and train election officials and conduct the election, including office managers, technical officers, trainers, recruitment officers and office support staff. Staff were trained in late March and early April before district electoral offices opened to the public on April 10.



Election officials

Elections BC hired 23,369 election officials to serve voters in voting places. Election officials fill a variety of roles in the voting place, including:

- Voting officers, who are responsible for voting stations. Voting officers issue ballots and maintain a ballot box. At the close of voting, voting officers count ballots and are responsible for ballot reconciliation.
- Voting clerks, who assist voting officers. Voting clerks maintain the voting book at a voting station and, during counting, record the votes on a tally sheet.
- Information officers, who direct voters to the appropriate voting station at a voting place, provide information to voters and assist voters with disabilities.
- Supervisory voting officers, who supervise the officials at a voting place.

Election officials worked at 347 advance voting places, 1,317 general voting places, and as mobile teams that visited hospitals, long-term care facilities and other locations to ensure accessible voting opportunities for all eligible voters.

Election official training used a blended learning approach, similar to the training provided to DEOs and DDEOs. Election officials completed an online training course that provided background and context about the election and the election official's role in the voting place. Online learning also prepared election officials for what to expect in the face-to-face classroom training that followed. Classroom training allowed election officials the opportunity to practice their assigned tasks and familiarize themselves with voting and reference materials in preparation for their role.

Youth at the Booth

A new initiative for the 2017 Provincial General Election, the Youth at the Booth program engaged youth in the electoral process by encouraging them to work as election officials. In collaboration with high schools across B.C., students between the ages of 15 and 19 were invited to apply as Youth at the Booth election officials. Youth at the Booth participants were hired as voting officers, voting clerks and information officers at voting places in their communities.

Over 200 high schools throughout B.C. registered for the program and more than 4,000 people under the age of 19 were hired as election officials, a 10% increase from the 2013 election.

The Youth at the Booth program encouraged a strong pool of qualified election officials with skill and comfort using technology, and promoted electoral participation and engagement to a new generation of voters. The program was popular with DEOs, school administrators and students who participated.

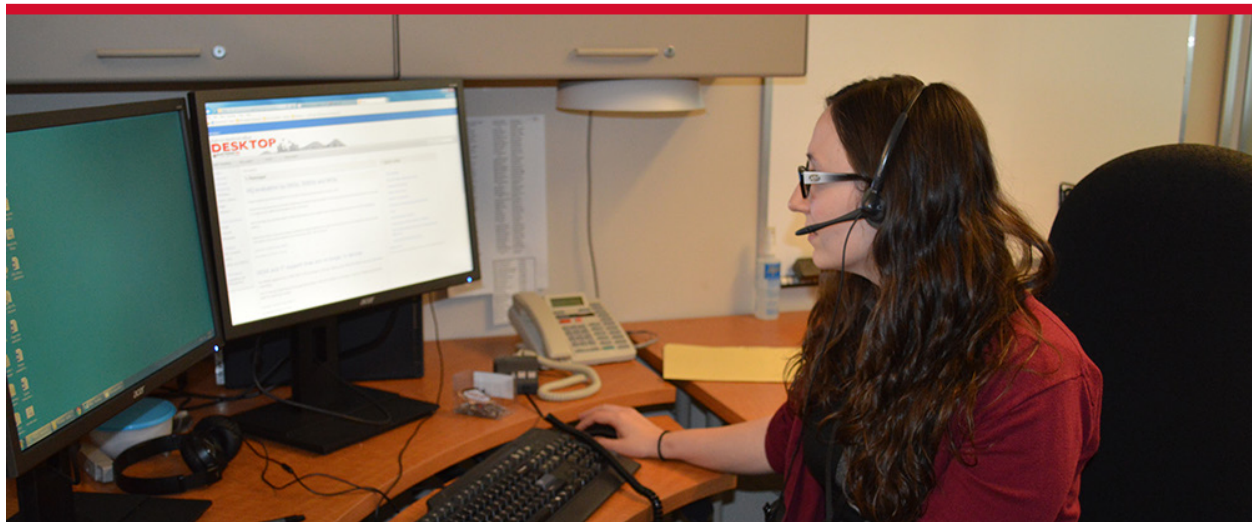

Headquarters staff












During a provincial general election, Elections BC's Victoria headquarters grows from approximately 55 full-time staff members to over 150. Temporary staff include senior event support assistants (SESAs), contact centre supervisors and operators, electoral finance compliance officers, warehouse distribution assistants, voting book reviewers and nomination clerks.

The support from HQ was outstanding! Candidate nominations

To be nominated as a candidate for election as a Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA), an individual must be qualified under the *Constitution Act* and the *Election Act* and file either a standing nomination or an ordinary nomination.

Elections BC accepts standing nominations for a fixed-date general election at any time until the end of the day before Writ Day. Ordinary nominations may only be filed between the time the election is called and 1 p.m. (Pacific time) on the seventh day after the election is called.

An individual becomes a candidate when their nomination has been accepted and a certificate of candidacy is issued. Certificates of candidacy for standing nominations are not issued until Writ Day.

The ordinary nomination period for the 2017 Provincial General Election closed at 1 p.m. (Pacific time) on April 18. There was a total of 371 candidates; 336 represented 18 registered political parties; 33 candidates ran as independents, and two candidates ran as neither independent nor as a representative of a registered political party. Two candidates withdrew their nominations. One individual submitted an ordinary nomination but withdrew before a certificate of candidacy was issued.

The number of candidates and registered political parties fielding candidates declined slightly from the 2013 Provincial General Election, in which 19 registered political parties were represented and 376 candidates were nominated, including 35 independent candidates and 11 with no affiliation.

The *Election Act* requires a political party to be deregistered after a general election if, for that general election and the immediately preceding general election, it was not represented by at least two candidates in one of the elections.

After the 2017 Provincial General Election one political party, People's Front, was deregistered for failing to run sufficient candidates in either the 2013 or 2017 general elections.

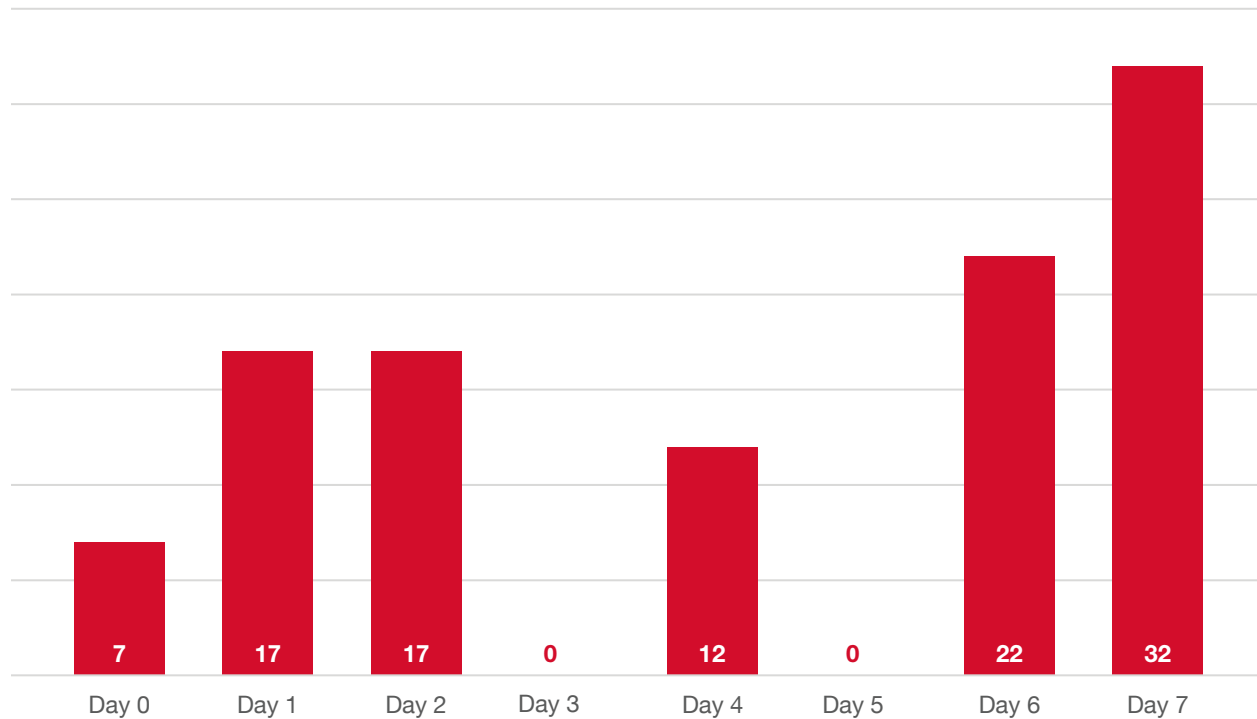
Of the 371 candidates nominated for the 2017 Provincial General Election, 71% filed standing nominations, representing a 21% increase over the 2013 Provincial General Election.

Of the 107 candidates who filed ordinary nominations, more than half filed in the last two days of the nomination period. The final day before the close of nominations saw the highest number of nominations filed. In the 2013 Provincial General Election approximately one third of ordinary nominations were filed in the final three days of the nomination period. The increase in the proportion of ordinary nominees filing close to the nomination deadline may be due to the relatively compressed nomination period, from 10 days in 2013 to 7 days in 2017.

Voting

Although a large number of “last minute” filers can delay key activities including ballot printing and the production of statutory advertising, the final list of candidates was completed and distributed by Elections BC on April 19, the day following the close of ordinary nominations.

Elections BC hired two nomination clerks and one supervisor to receive and process nominations, and the nomination team maintained close communication with registered political parties, candidates and their agents throughout the process to answer questions and provide support.

Voting

British Columbia provides voters with more voting opportunities than any other jurisdiction in Canada. In addition to general and advance voting, the *Election Act* establishes numerous special and absentee voting opportunities, providing for an accessible and inclusive electoral process.

Elections BC conducted voting at 347 advance voting places and 1,317 general voting places. Special voting opportunities were also available in hospitals and long-term care facilities, on post-secondary campuses, and at select transportation hubs and other important sites throughout the province. Starting on Writ Day, all eligible voters could vote in any district electoral office or by mail. Voters with disabilities were offered the opportunity to vote by telephone for the first time in the 2017 Provincial General Election.

Advance voting

Advance voting was held from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. (local time) on April 29 and 30 and May 3 to May 6. The six days of advance voting in 2017 reflect changes made to the *Election Act* in 2015 that increased the number of advance voting days from four in previous elections. Not all advance voting places were open on every day of the advance voting period, but at least one advance voting place was open in each electoral district on every advance voting day. Advance voting locations and the dates they were open were available on the Elections BC website in a variety of formats (including the Where to Vote application), advertised province-wide in community newspapers and printed on Where to Vote cards.

The proportion of voters who cast ballots at advance voting opportunities has steadily increased over the past six general elections, from 5.74% in 1996 to 30.17% in 2017.

Figure 4: Votes cast by voting opportunity

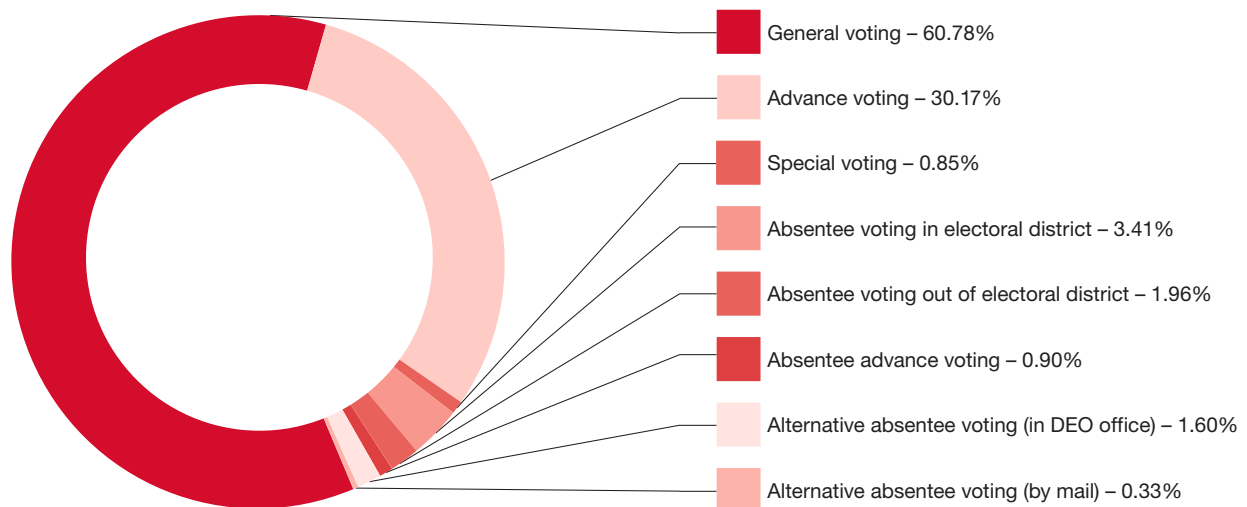
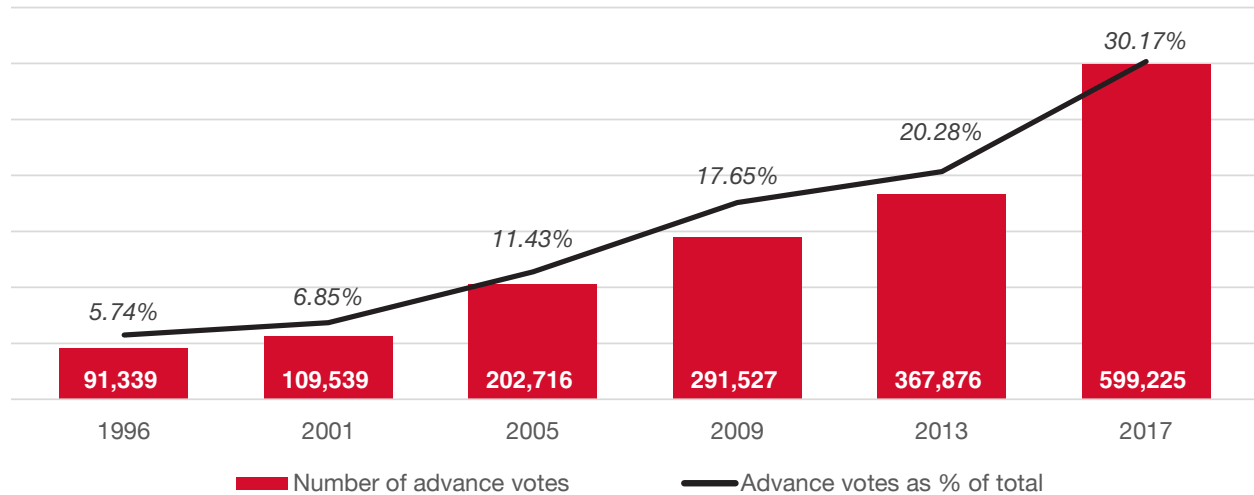
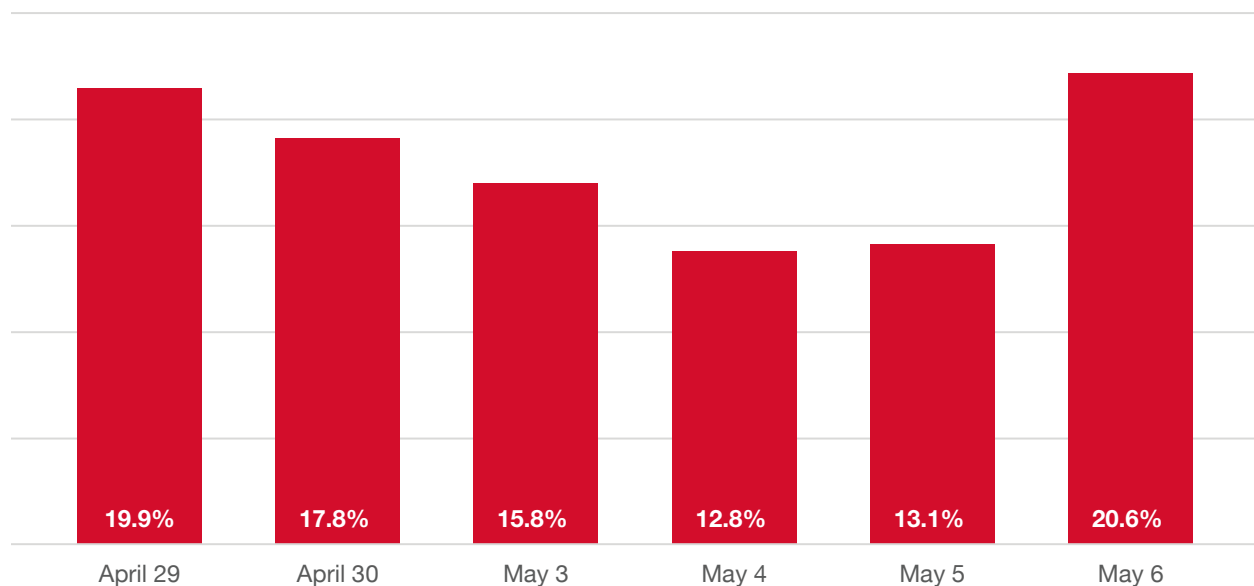


Figure 5: Advance votes, 1996-2017



The large increase in advance voting turnout over the 2013 Provincial General Election is likely due to the increased number of days of advance voting in 2017, the fact that the two additional days were on a weekend, and the growing awareness and popularity of this voting option. For the past few general elections, Elections BC has also worked to increase public awareness of the many voting opportunities available to voters other than voting at their assigned voting place on General Voting Day. Advance voting places were listed on the Where to Vote cards mailed to all registered voters and residences without registered voters, and Elections BC offered more advance voting places (347) than in any previous general election. Advertising also emphasized advance voting opportunities. As in previous elections, the first and last days of the advance voting period were the most popular.

Special voting

A district electoral officer may establish special voting opportunities for voters in their district. Special voting opportunities are usually established for voters who are unable to vote at other opportunities because they will be absent or are in a hospital, mental health or care facility, provincial correctional centre, or remote community or work site. Special voting opportunities can be held at any point in the election period until the close of voting on General Voting Day.

In 2017, district electoral officers established special voting opportunities at sites throughout the province. Additional special voting opportunities were established at the University of Victoria, before the winter term was completed and students left campus for the summer, and at the Prince George Airport (YXS). As a major transportation hub for northern B.C., this voting place served voters flying in or out of Prince George, and airport staff.

16,806 voters cast their ballot at special voting opportunities during the 2017 Provincial General Election.

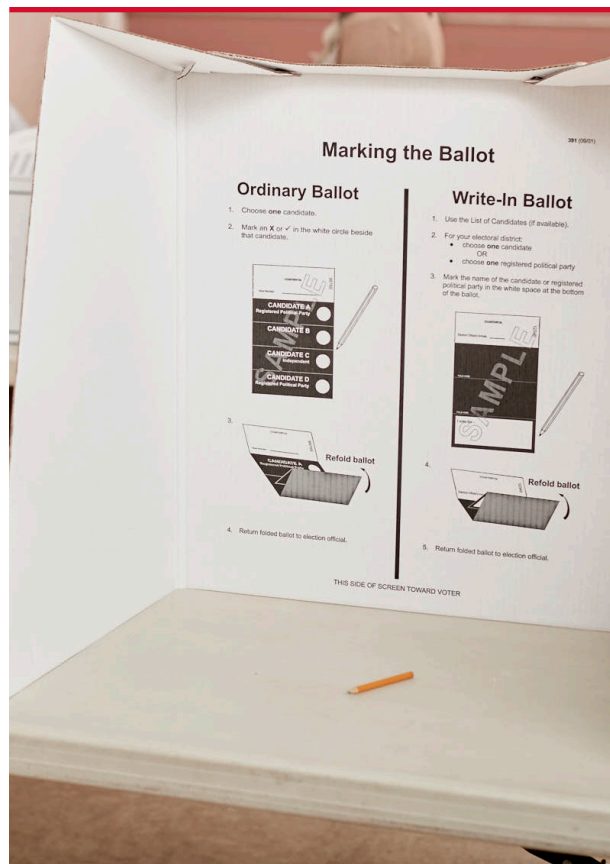
Absentee voting

Voters who voted at a voting place other than their assigned voting location on General Voting Day, or at an advance voting place outside of their electoral district, voted under absentee provisions. Absentee voting was available at all advance voting and general voting places. Voters who voted outside of their electoral district under absentee provisions used a write-in ballot to cast their vote for their electoral district of residence.

Voters were also able to vote in district electoral offices through alternative absentee voting. Voting in the district electoral office was available from when the election was called on April 11 until 4 p.m. (Pacific time) on General Voting Day. 124,598 absentee votes were cast at advance and general voting opportunities. 31,853 votes were cast in district electoral offices.

Several of the telephone voters made an impression... the lady born in 1916 who was so happy she could vote... a 35-year-old man who was bed-ridden and very ill from chemotherapy... another woman who hadn't voted in several elections because of advanced MS. Vote by mail

B.C. voters can request a vote by mail package. The package must be returned to the district electoral office that issued it before the close of voting. The vote by mail option enables voters who may be away from B.C. for an extended period of time to vote.

To address the length of time it takes to send and receive voting packages, particularly to remote areas and international destinations, Elections BC began sending voting packages to voters four weeks before the writs of election were issued. To meet the requirements of the *Election Act*, voters were instructed to not mark their ballot or return the voting package until after the writs were issued.

Elections BC sent voting packages to 59 countries and more than 10,000 voters. Every request for a vote by mail package was fulfilled. However, a significant number of voters who requested a voting package did not return it by the close of voting on General Voting Day. Some of these

voters may have chosen to attend another voting opportunity instead; requesting a voting package does not mean a voter is marked as having voted. Since the majority of voting packages were sent to addresses in B.C., many voters who did not return their voting package were likely able to find another opportunity to cast their ballot in person.

Telephone voting

The telephone voting project piloted in the 2017 Provincial General Election allowed voters with disabilities that prevented them from voting independently at another voting opportunity to cast their ballot by phone. As part of its commitment to provide an accessible electoral process, Elections BC administered telephone voting through the contact centre. Election official-assisted telephone voting was available on weekdays from April 19 to May 8 from 12 p.m. to 6 p.m. On General Voting Day, telephone voting was available from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Ensuring that voters who voted by telephone experienced the same right to privacy and secrecy as any other voter was an important consideration for Elections BC. The telephone voting process was developed to ensure the provisions of the *Election Act* would be met while also creating an accessible voting opportunity.

First, each caller's identity and eligibility was confirmed. The call was then transferred to an election official who was not told the identity of the voter. The election official administered voting for the voter, including marking the ballot on their behalf. A second election official, who also did not know the voter's identity, monitored the call and ensured the vote was cast according to the voter's wishes.

Although telephone voting was available beginning on April 19, the highest number of voters wishing to vote by phone called on General Voting Day. As a result, a call-back queue was established. Several headquarters staff were affirmed as election officials in order to provide more resources. Any voters waiting to vote by phone as of 8 p.m. on General Voting Day were considered to be the equivalent of "in line" at a voting place, and as with any other voting opportunity, were entitled to cast their ballot.

The telephone voting pilot was well-received and provided another accessible voting opportunity for voters with disabilities. More than 1,000 voters cast their ballot through telephone voting.

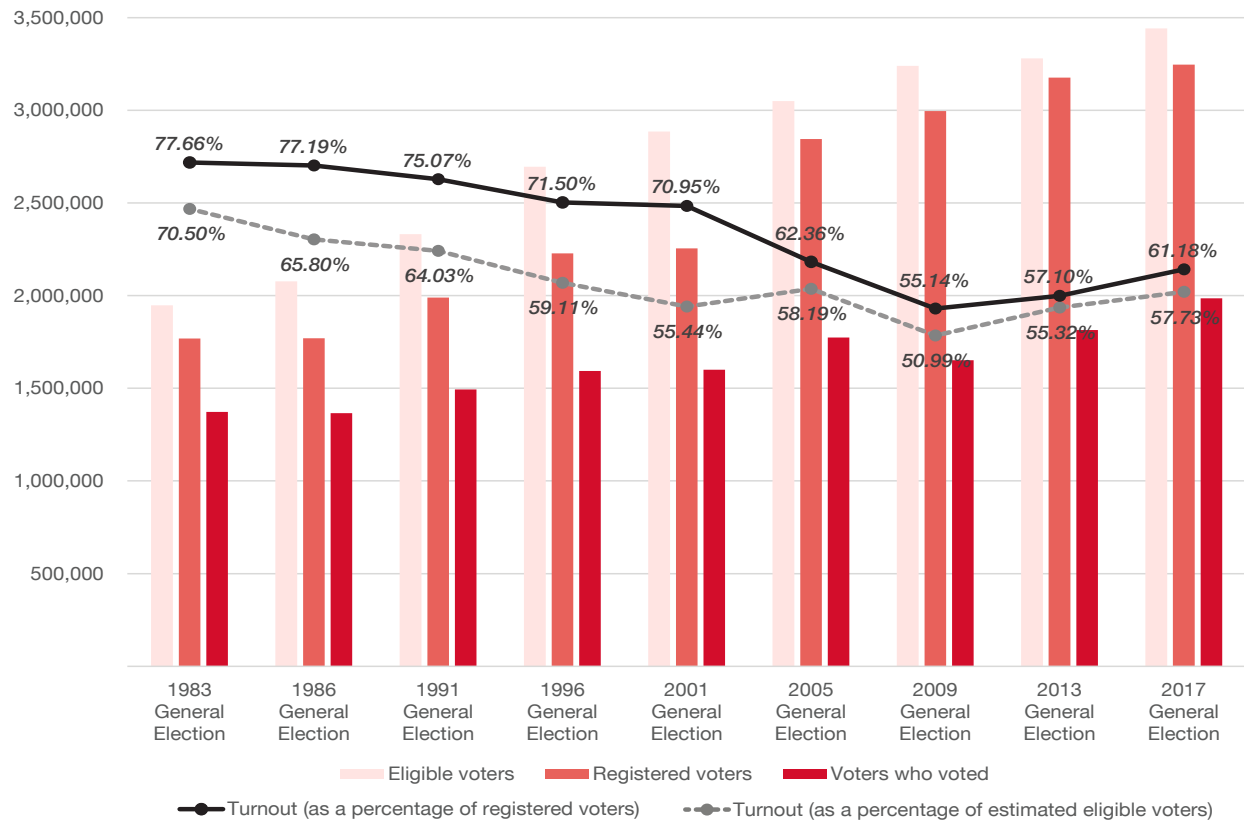
General voting

General Voting Day was May 9, 2017. Voting was available from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. (Pacific time) at 1,317 general voting places across the province. Voters were assigned a general voting place according to the voting area in which they resided. However, as part of B.C.'s accessible electoral process, all eligible voters could vote at any voting place in the province under absentee voting rules. 60.78% of ballots were cast on General Voting Day by voters at their assigned general voting place.

Turnout

Voter turnout in the 2017 Provincial General Election increased both as a percentage of eligible voters and as the total number of ballots cast, continuing an upward trend in voter turnout since the 2009 Provincial General Election.

The increase in turnout from 55.32% of estimated eligible voters in 2013 to 57.73% of estimated eligible voters in 2017 represents 170,000 more British Columbians who cast ballots in the 2017 Provincial General Election. The increase in turnout was reflected across all age groups.

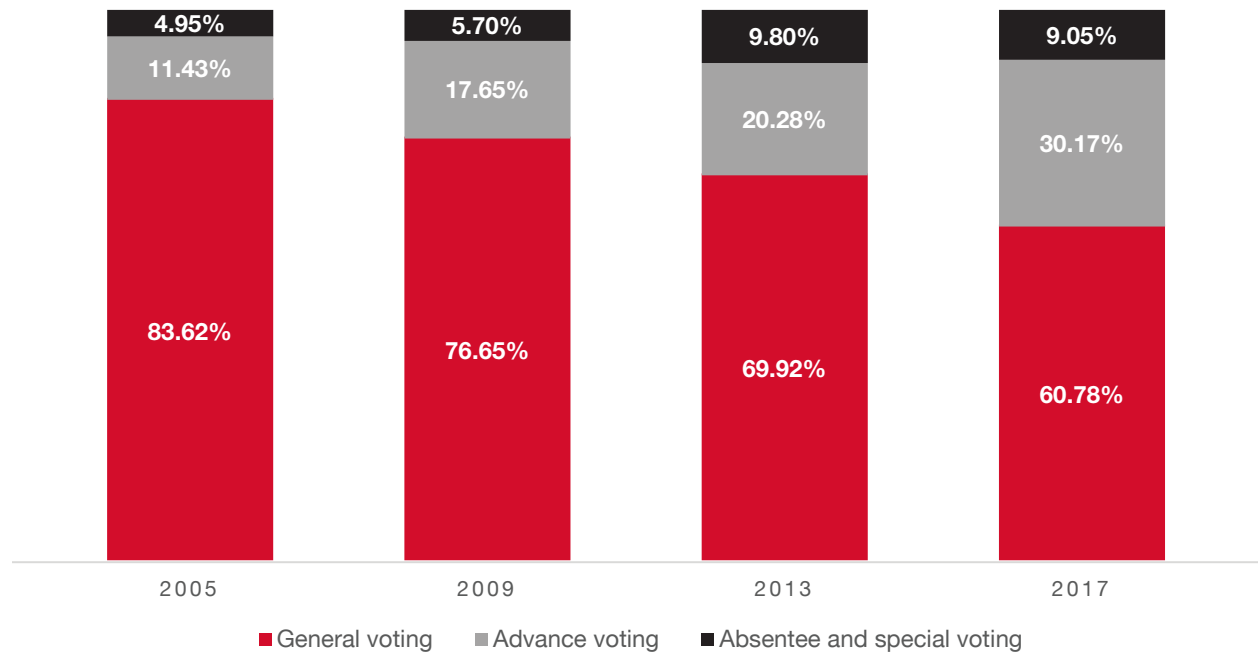

Trends

The 2017 Provincial General Election saw a continued shift in voting habits away from voting on General Voting Day at an assigned general voting place. More voters than ever before voted at advance, absentee and special voting opportunities.

Recognizing these trends, Elections BC anticipated increased participation at advance voting, voting in district electoral offices, and voting by mail. Elections BC prepared for a potential 30% voter turnout at advance voting. This figure was very close to the actual advance turnout rate of 30.17%.

At district electoral offices, absentee voting decreased slightly, from 1.96% in 2013 to 1.60% in 2017. The use of vote by mail packages also decreased by a small amount (from 0.37% in 2013 to 0.33% in 2017). The small decrease in these forms of absentee voting may be due to the extra days of advance voting providing more opportunities to voters who would otherwise have voted in the district electoral office or by mail.

Counting

Initial count

Ordinary ballots from advance voting and general voting are counted at initial count, conducted following the close of voting on General Voting Day. In the 2017 Provincial General Election, approximately 90% of the total ballots cast were considered at initial count.

At the close of initial count on election night, the BC Liberal Party led in 43 electoral districts, the BC NDP in 41, and the Green Party of BC in three.

Recounts

Under the *Election Act*, candidates or their official agents can request a recount of some or all of the ballots considered at initial count within three days after General Voting Day. Recount requests can only be made where:

- the difference between the top two candidates is close (defined in the *Election Act* as 100 votes or fewer); or
- votes were not correctly accepted or ballots were not correctly rejected, or a ballot account does not accurately record the number of votes for a candidate.

In 2017, six recount requests were received for five electoral districts.

Four of these requests did not meet the criteria above, and were not approved.

Recount requests were approved and recounts were conducted in two electoral districts, Courtenay-Comox and Vancouver-False Creek.

In Courtenay-Comox, the recount request was accepted because the difference between the top two candidates was nine votes. The recount was completed on May 22, 2017 and the margin between the top two candidates increased to 13 votes.

A recount request for Vancouver-False Creek was accepted because of a discrepancy between the advance voting ballot account for one candidate and the tally sheet and parcel envelope containing ballots for that candidate. The recount was completed on May 22, 2017 and the number of valid votes for two candidates decreased slightly. The results from initial count were confirmed.

A voter, candidate or district electoral officer for the electoral district may also make an application to the Supreme Court of British Columbia for a judicial recount. The application must be made within six days of the declaration of official results at the conclusion of final count. No judicial recounts were requested in the 2017 Provincial General Election.

Final count

Final count is a count of the ballots that were not considered as part of initial count. Ballots considered at final count include those cast at absentee, alternative absentee and special voting opportunities. The results of the election are determined at the conclusion of final count, based on the votes accepted at initial count and final count. Final count begins 13 days after General Voting Day, to allow enough time for absentee ballots contained in certification envelopes to be sent from where they were cast to the voter's district of residence. Final count in each electoral district is held in the district electoral office and may continue for up to three days.

Final count for the 2017 Provincial General Election began on May 22 and concluded on May 24. At the conclusion of final count, the seat count between the top three parties was unchanged from the results reported at initial count. The writs of election were returned on May 31, 2017, marking the end of the election period for the 41st Provincial General Election.

Notable events

Flooding in the Okanagan

In planning and administering a general election, Elections BC tries to account for all possibilities. Early in the planning process, risks, the probability that they will occur and their potential impact are identified and contingencies are put in place in the event that they do occur. Elections BC's risk management framework was put to the test during the 2017 Provincial General Election when severe flooding impacted several areas of the province.

Flooding in the Okanagan region began on May 5, continuing through the second advance voting period and the days leading up to General Voting Day. Some areas of the Kelowna-Lake Country, Boundary-Similkameen, Shuswap and Fraser Nicola electoral districts were evacuated due to flood waters and landslides or put on evacuation notice. Elections BC monitored the situation closely and took measures to ensure that all affected voters were able to cast their ballots.

- In Kelowna-Lake Country, the general voting place at Holiday Park Resort was not available due to flooding. Voters assigned to this general voting place were reassigned to the nearby general voting place at Winfield Memorial Hall.
- In Boundary-Similkameen, the general voting place at the Grand Forks Sr Hall was not available due to flooding. Voters assigned to this general voting place were reassigned to the nearby general voting place at Sacred Heart Catholic Church.
- In Shuswap, a landslide forced the closure of Sunnybrae Canoe Point Road at Robinson Creek. Evacuated residents were directed to vote at their nearest voting opportunity. A mobile team of election officials were deployed via water taxi to the area northeast of the closure to administer special voting door-to-door on General Voting Day.
- In Fraser-Nicola, Highways 8 and 97D were closed in both directions. The District Electoral Officer directed voters to other voting places accessible from their location.

The possibility of a natural disaster occurring and impacting voting places was identified as a risk during the process of planning the 2017 Provincial General Election. DEOs were well prepared and managed to make alternative voting arrangements on short notice.

Focus on final count

At the close of initial count on election night, the preliminary voting results showed a slim margin between the two leading political parties, both in seat count and in the popular vote. The BC Liberal Party led in 43 electoral districts, the BC NDP in 41 and the Green Party of BC in three. No party had reached the threshold of 44 or more seats needed to form a majority government. In four districts, the results of initial count showed a margin of 300 or fewer votes between the top two candidates.

On election night, Elections BC reported preliminary election results in each electoral district as ballots were counted. However, preliminary results do not include absentee ballots. Due to the close preliminary results, the outcome of the election could not be assumed until the conclusion of final count. This led to an unprecedented degree of public and media attention on the proceedings of district electoral officer recounts and final count.

In the two weeks between initial count and final count, Elections BC recognized its responsibility to provide accurate up-to-date information to the public as speculation about the election results grew. Through news releases, media interviews and social media, Elections BC provided the public with updates about the number of certification envelopes containing ballots to be counted at final count, both province-wide and by electoral district, as well as the status of district electoral officer recount requests.

As district electoral officer recounts and final count began on May 22, Elections BC made updated results available online at 10 a.m., noon, 2 p.m. and 5 p.m., or more frequently as counts in each electoral district were completed. On the afternoon of May 24, Courtenay-Comox was the last electoral district to complete counting and report its final results.

A topic of particular scrutiny during this period was the 13-day period between initial count and final count established under the *Election Act*. Under the current voting model, this period is needed to give DEOs enough time to ship certification envelopes containing absentee ballots to the voter's electoral district of residence, and receive and screen certification envelopes from other districts in preparation for final count. Elections BC is working on a proposal for a new voting model for future provincial general elections, and is considering ways in which the period between initial count and final count could be reduced or eliminated.

Orders

For the vast majority of voters, voting in the 2017 Provincial General Election proceeded without incident. In some instances, however, errors made by voters or election officials prompted the Chief Electoral Officer to issue an Order. Established by section 280 of the *Election Act*, an Order permits the Chief Electoral Officer to make exceptions to the Act if necessary because of an emergency, mistake or extraordinary circumstance. The Chief Electoral Officer issued 51 Orders related to the 2017 Provincial General Election. The majority of Orders were the result of election official errors, evidence of the complexity of provincial electoral legislation and the need to continue to review election official procedures with a view to simplify processes. Summaries of the Orders are provided below.

ORD001-2017

April 13, 2017

Due to extraordinary circumstances, the 2016 annual financial report of a registered political party was received by Elections BC after the filing deadline of March 31, 2017. The financial agent was granted an extension to April 10, 2017.

ORD002-2017

April 11, 2017

Election officials at the Oak Bay-Gordon Head district electoral office erred in providing a voter with a list of candidates for the incorrect district and the voter voted for a candidate from the incorrect district. When this error was discovered, the voter was invited to correctly vote based on the list of candidates for the correct electoral district. The certification envelope containing the ballot for the incorrect electoral district remained unopened at final count.

ORD003-2017

April 18, 2017

The candidate nomination documents for nominees in the Burnaby-Lougheed and Columbia River-Revelstoke electoral districts were incorrectly accepted as complete, prior to the deadline, even though they did not include a signed statement of service address as required by s. 54(3)(i) of the *Election Act*. This error was discovered during review after the submission deadline. The nomination documents for the candidates were accepted as if they were received with the signed statement of service address before the submission deadline.

ORD004-2017

April 19, 2017

The candidate nomination documents for a nominee in the Nechako Lakes electoral district were incorrectly accepted as complete, prior to the deadline, even though they did not include an appointment of auditor as required by s. 54(3)(f) of the *Election Act*. This error was discovered during review after the submission deadline. The nomination documents for the candidate were accepted as if they were received with the appointment of auditor before the submission deadline.

ORD005-2017

April 22, 2017

Three voters voted at a special voting – telephone voting opportunity for voters with disabilities in Victoria-Beacon Hill. Due to a technical error, the voters were provided lists of candidates for incorrect electoral districts instead of their electoral districts of residence. Each voter voted for candidates in the wrong electoral district. When this error was discovered, the voters were invited to correctly vote for their electoral district of residence. The certification envelopes containing the ballots for the incorrect electoral district remained unopened at final count.

ORD006-2017*April 22, 2017*

Election officials at the Vancouver-Fraserview district electoral office erred in providing a voter with a list of candidates for the incorrect electoral district and the voter voted for a candidate from the incorrect electoral district. When this error was discovered, the voter was invited to correctly vote based on the list of candidates for the correct electoral district. The certification envelope containing the ballot for the incorrect electoral district remained unopened at final count.

ORD007-2017*April 24, 2017*

A voter applied for and received a voting package under s. 106 of the *Election Act* in Victoria-Beacon Hill. The voter is physically disabled and was unable to mark the ballot, sign the certification envelope, and assemble the voting package independently. The voter's wife was permitted to mark the ballot and sign the certification envelope on behalf of her husband. She had to affirm that she would preserve the secrecy of the ballot, mark the ballot in accordance with her husband's wishes, and refrain from influencing how he voted. The certification envelope was considered for final count as if it had been completed in accordance with s. 106.

ORD008-2017*April 29, 2017*

Election officials at advance voting opportunities in Columbia River-Revelstoke, Penticton, and Vancouver-Hastings did not notice that two write-in ballots were stuck together and issued both ballots to each of the voters. During preparations for final count, the secrecy envelopes were opened and examined by the District Electoral Officer. If both write-in ballots were marked, they remained uncounted at final count. If only one write-in ballot was marked, the unmarked ballot was set aside and not considered at final count, while the marked ballot was considered at final count.

ORD009-2017*April 29, 2017*

Election officials at advance voting opportunities in Abbotsford-Mission, Burnaby-Edmonds, Langley, Richmond South Centre, Skeena, Surrey-White Rock, Vancouver-Kensington, and Vancouver-Quilchena erred in putting voters' marked ballots directly into the ballot box instead of into secrecy and certification envelopes. These ballots were the only write-in ballots placed into the respective ballot boxes. Empty secrecy and certification envelopes were stapled together and placed into the respective ballot boxes. At initial count, the marked ballots were identified, inserted into the voters' secrecy and certification envelopes and were considered at final count.

ORD010-2017*April 30, 2017*

Two voters were incorrectly advised at advance voting opportunities in North Vancouver-Seymour and Nelson-Creston to vote under the absentee provisions of s. 101 of the *Election Act*. The voters resided within these electoral districts so they should have voted under s. 97. In error, the voters were provided lists of candidates for their electoral districts and write-in ballots, which were placed into secrecy and certification envelopes before going into the ballot boxes. The certification envelopes were accepted for consideration at initial and final count as if they had been administered correctly at a valid s. 101 advance absentee voting opportunity.

ORD011-2017*May 7, 2017*

A voter was incorrectly advised at an advance voting opportunity in Nanaimo to vote under the absentee provisions of s. 101 of the *Election Act*. The voter resided within the electoral district so should have voted under s. 97. In error, the voter was provided an incorrect candidate list and a write-in ballot, and, as a result, voted for a candidate in the wrong electoral district. When the error was discovered, the voter was invited to vote again, correctly, at the office of the District Electoral Officer. The envelope cast in the district electoral office was considered for final count, while the first certification envelope remained unopened.

ORD012-2017*May 8, 2017*

Election officials at site-based voting areas and mobile voting locations in several electoral districts erred when administering voting to some non-resident, in-district voters. The marked ordinary ballots of these non-resident voters went directly into the respective ballot boxes instead of in secrecy and certification envelopes. The general voting book records of these voters were struck through to prevent them voting at general voting, and the ballots cast by these voters were then considered at initial count.

ORD013-2017*May 2, 2017*

Election officials at an advance voting opportunity in Stikine completed a voter's certification envelope incorrectly, and then put the certification envelope into the ballot box without having first recorded the required voter information on the envelope. Rather this was recorded on an advance voting certificate. At initial count, election officials recorded the required information on the voter's certification envelope and the envelope was considered at final count.

ORD014-2017*May 8, 2017*

The election officials at some advance voting stations erred in not having all voters sign the requisite voting documents or voting books. Missing signatures included those in advance and absentee voting books, on advance voting certificates, and on certification envelopes cast under s. 101 of the *Election Act*. The ballots and certification envelopes were considered to have been administered correctly.

ORD015-2017*May 2, 2017*

Election officials at an advance voting place opportunity in Surrey-Cloverdale erred in completing documentation for s. 97 voting instead of s. 101 voting. The voter's write-in ballot was placed directly into the ballot box without first going into secrecy and certification envelopes. Upon receipt of this Order, the district electoral officer correctly prepared a certification and secrecy envelope for the voter, and placed them in the voting document envelope for the voting book for that opportunity. On opening the ballot box at initial count, the voter's write-in ballot was placed into the secrecy and certification envelopes, and the certification envelope was considered at final count.

ORD016-2017*May 7, 2017*

Election officials at advance voting opportunities in Abbotsford West and Kelowna West erred in putting voters' marked write-in ballots directly into the ballot box instead of in secrecy and certification envelopes. These ballots were the only write-in ballots placed into the respective ballot boxes. The election officials immediately noticed the errors, stapled the empty secrecy envelopes to the certification envelopes, and placed both envelopes into the respective ballot boxes. At initial count, the write-in ballots were inserted into the voters' secrecy and certification envelopes, and the certification envelopes were considered at final count.

ORD017-2017*May 2, 2017*

Election officials attending a special voting opportunity in Burnaby-Edmonds erred in putting a voter's marked write-in ballot directly into the ballot box instead of in secrecy and certification envelopes. This ballot was the only write-in ballot placed into the ballot box. Election officials immediately noticed the error, secured the empty secrecy and certification envelopes, and placed them in the voting documents envelope at the back of the voting book. At initial count, the write-in ballot was inserted into the voter's secrecy and certification envelopes, and the certification envelope was considered at final count.

ORD018-2017*May 2, 2017*

A voter requested a voting package under s. 106 of the *Election Act*. It was determined that due to clerical error, the request was not processed in a timely manner. As a result, the voter did not receive their voting package in sufficient time for them to complete and return the voting package by the close of general voting. The voter was permitted to return their voting package provided that it was time and date stamped by postal services prior to the close of voting on May 9, 2017 (8 p.m. Pacific Time), and that it was received on or before May 19, 2017, prior to the start of final count.

ORD019-2017*May 7, 2017*

Election officials at advance voting opportunities in Burnaby-Deer Lake, Delta South, Maple Ridge-Pitt Meadows, Vancouver-False Creek, Vancouver-Mount Pleasant, and West Vancouver-Sea to Sky erred in not noticing that two write-in ballots were stuck together, and issued both ballots to each of the voters. During preparations for final count, the secrecy envelopes were opened and examined by the respective district electoral officers. If both write-in ballots were marked, they remained uncounted at final count. If only one write-in ballot was marked, the unmarked ballot was set aside and not considered at final count, while the marked ballot was considered at final count.

ORD020-2017*May 3, 2017*

Election officials at an advance voting opportunity in Vancouver-Fraserview erred in putting voters' marked ballots into secrecy and certification envelopes instead of directly into the ballot box. The voters signed the necessary declaration, and voted with the correct ballot for s. 97 voting. The certification envelopes were considered at final count.

ORD021-2017*May 7, 2017*

Election officials at an advance voting opportunity in Vancouver-Fraserview erred in placing a voter's write-in ballot directly into the ballot box rather than in secrecy and certification envelopes. This ballot was the only write-in ballot placed into that ballot box. The empty certification envelope bearing the voter's signature and the secrecy envelope were placed in the voting document envelope in the back of the voting book. At initial count, the voter's write-in ballot was placed in the secrecy and certification envelopes, and the certification envelope was considered at final count.

ORD022-2017*May 7, 2017*

Election officials at the district electoral office in Surrey-Whalley erred in providing incorrect certification envelopes that did not include the required declaration to voters. The certification envelopes were considered at final count as if the correct envelopes had been used.

ORD023-2017*May 9, 2017*

Elections officials at district electoral offices in Maple Ridge-Pitt Meadows, Vancouver-Fraserview, and Vancouver-West End erred in putting voters' marked write-in ballots directly into the ballot box instead of in secrecy and certification envelopes. These ballots were the only loose write-in ballots placed into the respective ballot boxes. The election officials immediately noticed their errors, and either secured the empty secrecy and certification envelopes and placed them in the voting documents envelope at the back of the voting book, or placed them directly into the ballot box. At initial count, the voters' marked write-in ballots were sealed in the secrecy and certification envelopes, and the certification envelopes were considered at final count.

ORD024-2017*May 5, 2017*

Election officials at advance voting opportunities in Kootenay West, Vancouver-West End, and West Vancouver-Sea to Sky erred in placing voters' write-in ballots directly into the ballot boxes instead of in secrecy and certification envelopes. The voters' write-in ballots were the only such ballots in each respective ballot box. When this error was discovered, the voters were invited to vote again correctly. At initial count, the loose write-in ballots were sealed in secrecy envelopes and set aside. The voters' correctly cast certification envelopes were considered at final count.

ORD025-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at site-based voting areas and mobile voting locations in Kootenay East, Langley East, and Penticton erred when administering voting to some non-resident, in-district voters. While certification envelopes were completed as required under s. 98 of the *Election Act*, the marked ordinary ballots of these voters went directly into the respective ballot boxes instead of in secrecy and certification envelopes. The general voting book records of these voters were struck through to prevent them voting at general voting, and the ballots cast by these voters were then considered at initial count.

ORD026-2017*May 5, 2017*

Election officials at a special voting opportunity in Saanich South erred in putting a voter's marked write-in ballot directly into the ballot box instead of in secrecy and certification envelopes. The election officials stapled the empty secrecy envelope to the certification envelope, and placed both envelopes into the ballot box. The write-in ballot was the only such ballot in the ballot box. At initial count, the write-in ballot was inserted into the voter's secrecy and certification envelope, and the certification envelope was considered at final count.

ORD027-2017*May 5, 2017*

Election officials at the district electoral office of West Vancouver-Sea to Sky erred in putting a voter's marked write-in ballot directly into the ballot box instead of in secrecy and certification envelopes. The election official immediately noticed the error, and permitted the voter to vote a second time following correct procedures. The write-in ballot was the only ballot in the ballot box not in a secrecy envelope. At initial count, the loose write-in ballot was sealed in a spare secrecy envelope and set aside. The voter's correctly cast certification envelope was considered at final count.

ORD028-2017*May 7, 2017*

Several voters at advance and special voting opportunities in Port Moody-Coquitlam, Vancouver-Langara, and Vancouver-Point Grey were provided incorrect lists of candidates to use with their write-in ballots, and therefore voted for candidates in the wrong electoral districts. When this error was discovered, the voters were invited to vote again, correctly, for their electoral districts of residence. The second certification envelopes were considered at final count while the first certification envelopes remained unopened at final count.

ORD029-2017*May 6, 2017*

Election officials at an advance voting opportunity in Abbotsford-Mission erred in placing a voter's counterfoil into the secrecy and certification envelopes instead of the voter's marked write-in ballot. When this error was discovered, the voter's ballot was sealed in a second secrecy envelope, marked with the voter's name, and placed into the ballot box. At initial count, the certification envelope was opened and the secrecy envelope containing the counterfoil taken out and set aside. The secrecy envelope containing the voter's ballot was inserted and sealed into the voter's certification envelope. The certification envelope was considered at final count.

ORD030-2017*May 8, 2017*

A voter who attended an advance voting opportunity in Vancouver-False Creek left the voting place with their ballot. The voter returned the ballot to the district electoral officer eight days later and was permitted to vote. The ballot was placed in secrecy and certification envelope bearing the name and signed declaration of the voter. At initial count, the certification envelope containing the ballot was given to the responsible election official. Before opening the ballot box to count ballots, the certification and secrecy envelopes subject to the Order were opened and the voter's marked ballot was inserted into the ballot box and considered for initial count.

ORD031-2017*May 8, 2017*

On May 5, 2017, the District Electoral Officer of North Coast was notified that the election officials that had been hired to administer general voting in the First Nation community of Klemtu, B.C. were unable to work the hours required by the *Election Act* due to a death in the community. Klemtu is a remote community that is only accessible by boat or float-plane. Due to the location of the community and the timing in the election period, the District Electoral Officer was unable to secure and deploy a replacement election official team. To provide the voters in Klemtu with an opportunity to vote, voting was held from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. on May 6, 2017, as well as on May 9 from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. The voting opportunities provided to the voters to whom this Order applies were considered as their general voting opportunity for the election. The votes cast were considered at initial count.

ORD032-2017*May 8, 2017*

Election officials at special voting opportunities in Cariboo-Chilcotin and Langley erred in putting the voters' marked write-in ballots directly into the ballot boxes rather than in secrecy and certification envelopes. When the election officials noticed their errors, they placed the empty secrecy and certification envelopes in the voting documents envelopes at the back of the respective voting books. The write-in ballots were the only ballots in the ballot boxes not in secrecy envelopes. At initial count, the voters' marked write-in ballots were sealed in their secrecy and certification envelopes. These certification envelopes were considered at final count.

ORD033-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at voting opportunities in several electoral districts erred in not instructing all voters who voted under the provisions of s. 96 of the *Election Act* to sign the voting book as required by the Act. The ballots cast by these voters were considered cast as if the voters had signed the necessary declaration in the voting books.

ORD034-2017*May 9, 2017*

Several voters attended general voting opportunities in Cariboo-Chilcotin, Kelowna West, Nelson-Creston, Skeena, and Vancouver-Kingsway to voter under the provisions of s. 99 of the *Election Act*. In error, the election officials placed the voters' marked ordinary ballots directly into the respective ballot boxes rather than in secrecy and certification envelopes. The ballots cast by these voters were considered at initial count.

ORD035-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at a general voting opportunity in Kelowna West did not notice that two ordinary ballots were stuck together, and issued both ballots to the voter. The two ballots were placed in the ballot box. The ballot box was immediately sealed and there were no other ballots in the box. At initial count, the two ballots were unfolded and examined by the election official responsible. If both ballots were marked, they were set aside. If one of them was unmarked, the unmarked ballot was set aside while the marked ballot was considered at initial count.

ORD036-2017*May 9, 2017*

Several voters attended general voting opportunities in Burnaby-Deer Lake, Delta South, Fraser-Nicola, Shuswap, Surrey-Green Timbers, Surrey-Newton, and Vancouver-Point Grey to vote under the provisions of s. 99 and 100 of the *Election Act*. In error, the voters' marked ballots were put directly into the respective ballot boxes instead of into secrecy and certification envelopes. The election officials immediately noticed their errors, and either inserted the empty secrecy and certification envelopes into the ballot boxes, or stored them in the voting documents envelopes at the back of the voting books. The ballots were the only ballots in the respective ballot boxes not contained in certification envelopes. At initial count, the voters' marked ballots were sealed in their secrecy and certification envelopes, and the certification envelopes were considered at final count.

ORD037-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at an absentee voting opportunity in Vancouver-Fraserview erred in providing write-in ballots to some voters voting under s. 99 of the *Election Act*, rather than ordinary ballots as required by the Act. The write-in ballots were not rejected at final count on the basis that the incorrect ballot was used.

ORD038-2017*May 9, 2017*

Several voters who attended general voting places in Langley and West Vancouver-Capilano to vote under the absentee provisions of the *Election Act* were provided incorrect ballots. When this error was discovered, the voters were invited to vote again correctly. The second certification envelopes were considered at final count while the first certification envelopes were not opened at final count.

ORD039-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at general and absentee voting opportunities in Cariboo-Chilcotin, Cariboo North, Fraser-Nicola, and Richmond-Steveston erred by issuing a number of voters write-in ballots when they should have been issued ordinary ballots. The write-in ballots cast by the voters who voted under s. 99 of the *Election Act* were not rejected at final count, and the write-in ballots cast by the voters who voted under s. 96 of the Act were not rejected at initial count on the basis that the incorrect ballot was used.

ORD040-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at an absentee voting opportunity in Vancouver-Kingsway erred in putting a voter's marked ballot into a ballot box, without first being sealed in secrecy and certification envelopes. The marked ballot still had the counterfoil attached. The election officials immediately noticed their errors and inserted the empty secrecy and certification envelopes into the voting documents envelope at the back of the absentee voting book. At initial count, the counterfoil was removed and set aside, and the ballot was sealed in secrecy and certification envelopes. The certification envelope was considered at final count.

ORD041-2017*May 9, 2017*

At initial count, election officials at a voting place in Nanaimo-North Cowichan erred in opening 77 certification envelopes that had been cast under s. 99 of the *Election Act*. The election officials were not able to balance their ballot account and were checking to determine whether each of the certification envelopes contained a secrecy envelope. No secrecy envelopes were removed from the certification envelopes in this process. All opened certification envelopes were resealed and considered for final count as if they had been administered correctly.

ORD042-2017*May 9, 2017*

Two voters attended district electoral offices in Langley and West Vancouver-Sea to Sky to vote. Due to election official error, the voters' ballots were cast incorrectly. In Langley, the voter's ballot was placed into an unmarked certification envelope instead of the voter's signed certification envelope. In West Vancouver-Sea to Sky, the voter did not sign their certification envelope containing their ballot, and was directed to sign a second, empty, secrecy envelope. At initial count, the unmarked certification envelope containing the ballot cast in Langley was opened, and the secrecy envelope containing the ballot was resealed into the second certification envelope signed by the voter. The two certification envelopes placed into the ballot box in West Vancouver-Sea to Sky were stapled together and considered as one single, correctly cast, certification envelope. The certification envelopes were considered at initial and final counts as if they had been administered correctly. The unmarked certification envelope was set aside.

ORD043-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at absentee voting opportunities in Cowichan Valley and Burnaby-Deer Lake erred by mixing up voters' certification and secrecy envelopes, resulting in voters' ballots being placed into the incorrect certification envelopes. At initial count, these voter's certification envelopes were opened and the secrecy envelopes inserted into the correct certification envelopes. The corrected certification envelopes were considered at initial and final count.

ORD044-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at a special voting opportunity in Nanaimo erred in not recording voter information and not providing certification envelopes to voters. It was impossible to associate ballots with certification envelopes to ensure the correct ballots would be considered at final count. All ballots to which this Order applies were set aside and not considered at initial count or final count.

ORD045-2017*May 9, 2017*

At initial count, election officials at a voting place in Vancouver-Fraserview erred in opening some certification envelopes that had been cast under s. 101 and counted the write-in ballots contained therein along with the ordinary ballots administered at that station. Following the count it was impossible to associate all write-in ballots with the voters who had cast them, to ensure the correct ballots would be considered at final count. All ballots and certification envelopes to which this Order applies were set aside and not considered at initial count or final count.

ORD046-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials administering site-based voting area and special voting in Maple Ridge-Pitt Meadows erred in placing marked ordinary ballots in secrecy and certification envelopes instead of directly into the ballot box. The election officials compounded their error at initial count by opening the certification envelopes and counting the ballots along with the other s. 96 ballots in the ballot box. An additional resident, in error, was provided a write-in ballot instead of an ordinary ballot to cast their vote, which was placed directly into the ballot box. All voters were resident in Maple Ridge-Pitt Meadows, only voted once, and voted for the correct candidates. The ballots cast by these voters were accepted at initial count as if they were administered correctly.

ORD047-2017*May 9, 2017*

An absentee voting station at a general voting location in Vancouver-Quilchena was not provided sufficient write-in ballots to meet the requirements of the voters who attended to vote under the provisions of s. 100 of the *Election Act*. Some voters were provided ordinary ballots and they were allowed to write the name of their candidate or registered political party of choice on the back of the ordinary ballot for the purposes of voting under s. 100 of the *Election Act*. At final count, these ballots were considered as if they were the ballots officially supplied for the election.

ORD048-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at special voting opportunities in Burnaby-Deer Lake and Vancouver-Point Grey erred in not noticing that two ballots were stuck together, and issued both ballots to two voters. During preparations for final count, the secrecy envelopes were opened and examined by the respective district electoral officers. If both ballots were marked, they remained uncounted at final count. If only one ballot was marked, the unmarked ballot was set aside and not considered at final count, while the marked ballot was considered at final count.

ORD049-2017*May 9, 2017*

Election officials at an advance voting opportunity in Cariboo-Chilcotin erred in providing a write-in ballot to a voter, which was placed in secrecy and certification envelopes instead of providing an ordinary ballot, which should have gone directly into the ballot box. At initial count, the voter's certification and secrecy envelopes were opened and the ballot was accepted for initial count. The ballot was not rejected on the basis that the incorrect ballot was used.

ORD050-2017*June 30, 2017*

Due to extraordinary circumstances, a candidate's financial agent was unable to file a financing report for the 2017 Provincial General Election by the deadline of August 8, 2017. The candidate's financial agent was granted an extension to October 6, 2017 to file the report.

ORD051-2017*August 9, 2017*

Due to extraordinary circumstances, eight candidates' financial agents were unable to file financing reports for the 2017 Provincial General Election by the deadline of August 8, 2017. The candidates' financial agents were granted extensions to file the reports.

Introduction

Under the *Election Act*, financial agents for candidates, registered political parties represented by a candidate in an election and associated registered constituency associations are required to file election financing reports with the Chief Electoral Officer within 90 days after General Voting Day. Individuals and organizations that sponsor election advertising are required to register with Elections BC. Registered election advertising sponsors who sponsor election advertising with a value of \$500 or more are required to file election advertising disclosure reports within 90 days after General Voting Day.

Following are summaries of election financing reports and election advertising disclosure reports received by Elections BC. The summaries reflect the financing reports as filed and do not include subsequent amendments. After filing, Elections BC staff review the reports for accuracy and completeness. The filed reports and any subsequent amendments are available for viewing on the Elections BC website. Because Elections BC does not include cents in the summaries, there may be some small differences from the original reports due to rounding.

The financial filing deadline was 4:30 p.m. on August 8, 2017.

Election expenses limits

The expenses limits for the 2017 Provincial General Election were:

- \$77,674.62 for candidates
- \$4,882,404.95 for registered political parties
- \$3,328.91 in relation to a single electoral district and \$166,445.62 overall for third party advertising sponsors

Registered constituency associations are prohibited from incurring election expenses except on behalf of a candidate, and any such expenses are considered to be election expenses of the candidate. Therefore, constituency associations do not have an election expenses limit.

Registered political parties

The election financing information in this report includes both the total inflows and total outflows for each registered political party which endorsed a candidate. Total inflows and total outflows may not be equal. This commonly occurs because the reporting periods are different for inflows and outflows.

Total inflows include income and loans received. Except for other income, total inflows are reported from January 1, 2017 to the close of voting on General Voting Day. Other income is miscellaneous income related to the election only.

Political contributions: amount of money or the value of any property or services provided without compensation by way of donation, advance, deposit, discount or otherwise.

Transfers received: non-reciprocal receipts of money, goods or services from a registered constituency association, a candidate or a leadership contestant.

Fundraising income: the portion of income from fundraising functions that is not reported as political contributions.

Other income: income related to the election from miscellaneous sources.

Loans received: the original amount of loans received for election expenses. Some or all of the loan may have been repaid.

Total outflows are related to the election only and are categorized as follows:

Election expenses subject to the expenses limits: the value of property or services used during the campaign period, by or on behalf of a registered political party, registered constituency association, or a candidate to promote or oppose a registered political party or a candidate (e.g. advertising and campaign office expenses). The campaign period is the time between when an election is called (April 11, 2017) and the close of general voting (May 9, 2017). The *Election Act* limits the amount of election expenses a registered political party or candidate can incur during this period.

Election expenses not subject to the expenses limits: election expenses specifically excluded from the election expenses limits (e.g. audit fees). This type of expense is described in section 203 of the *Election Act*.

Other expenses: the value of goods and services used outside the campaign period but in relation to the election.

Transfers given: non-reciprocal provisions of money, goods or services to a registered constituency association, a candidate or a leadership contestant.

Registered constituency associations

Registered constituency associations are prohibited from incurring election expenses, except on behalf of a candidate. All election expenses incurred on behalf of a candidate must be included in the candidate's election expenses. Therefore, constituency associations do not report any expenses in their election financing reports. The only outflows reported are transfers given between January 1, 2017 and General Voting Day. Total inflows include income and loans received. Income is from January 1, 2017 to the close of voting on General Voting Day.

Political contributions: amount of money or the value of any property or services provided without compensation by way of donation, advance, deposit, discount or otherwise.

Transfers received: non-reciprocal receipts of money, goods or services from a registered political party or a candidate.

Fundraising income: the portion of income from fundraising functions that is not reported as political contributions.

Loans received: the original amount of loans received for election expenses. Some or all of the loan may have been repaid.

The only outflows reported by registered constituency associations in election financing reports are:

Transfers given: non-reciprocal provisions of money, goods or services to a registered political party or a candidate.

Candidates

The election financing information for candidates in this report includes both the total inflows and outflows. Total inflows and total outflows may not be equal. This commonly occurs when items owned by a candidate prior to a campaign period are used, and therefore reported as election expenses but not as inflows.

Political contributions: amount of money or the value of any property or services provided without compensation by way of donation, advance, deposit, discount or otherwise.

Transfers received: non-reciprocal receipts of money, goods or services from a registered political party or a registered constituency association.

Fundraising income: the portion of income from fundraising functions that is not reported as political contributions.

Other income: income related to the election from miscellaneous sources.

Loans received: the original amount of loans received for election expenses. Some or all of the loan may have been repaid.

Total outflows are categorized as follows:

Election expenses subject to the expenses limits: the value of property or services used during the campaign period, by or on behalf of a registered political party, registered constituency association, or a candidate to promote or oppose a registered political party or a candidate (e.g. advertising and campaign office expenses). The campaign period is the time between when an election is called (April 11, 2017) and the close of general voting (May 9, 2017). The *Election Act* limits the amount of election expenses a registered political party or candidate can incur.

Election expenses not subject to the

expenses limits: election expenses specifically excluded from the election expenses limits (e.g. nomination deposits and audit fees). This type of expense is described in section 203 of the *Election Act*.

Other expenses: the value of goods and services used outside the campaign period but in relation to the election.

Transfers given: non-reciprocal provisions of money, goods or services to a registered political party or a registered constituency association.

Registered election advertising sponsors

The following definitions are relevant to election advertising sponsors:

Election advertising: the transmission, by any means, of an advertising message to the public that:

- is transmitted during the campaign period, and
- promotes or opposes, directly or indirectly, a registered political party or the election of a candidate. This includes taking a position on an issue with which a candidate or registered political party is associated.

Election advertising does not include:

- messages on the Internet that do not and would not normally have a placement cost, including free social media posts, websites and videos.
- the publication without charge of news, an editorial, an interview, a column, a letter, a debate, a speech or a commentary in a bona fide periodical publication or a radio or television program,
- the distribution of a book, or the promotion of the sale of a book, for no less than its commercial value, if the book was planned to be made available to the public regardless of whether there was to be an election,

- the transmission of a document directly by a person or group to their members, employees or shareholders, or
- the transmission by an individual, on a non-commercial basis on the Internet, or by telephone or text messaging, of his or her personal political views.

Contributions: money provided to a sponsor of election advertising during the period beginning six months before an election is called and ending on General Voting Day.

Amount of sponsor's assets used: the value of the sponsor's assets used to pay for election advertising. This amount does not include contributions referred to above.

Value of election advertising: the market value of preparing and conducting election advertising.

All election advertising sponsors must be registered. Under section 244 of the *Election Act*, an election advertising sponsor is not required to file a disclosure report if, during the campaign period, the advertising sponsored did not have a total value of \$500 or more.

The summaries of disclosure reports for election advertising sponsors who sponsored election advertising with a total value of \$500 or more are included in this report.

Filing deadlines

Election financing and disclosure reports for the 2017 Provincial General Election were due at 4:30 p.m. on August 8, 2017. The Chief Electoral Officer granted extensions due to extraordinary circumstances to nine candidates. The following five candidates filed their reports by the late filing deadline at 4:30 p.m. on September 7, 2017 and paid a \$500 late filing fee:

- Steve Darling
- Garrison Duke
- Scott Hamilton
- Steve Houser
- Linda Reimer

One candidate, Merv Ritchie, failed to file by the late filing deadline and subsequently is disqualified from being nominated, elected or holding office as a member of the Legislative Assembly until after the next general election, unless the outstanding financing report is filed and a late filing penalty of \$10,000 is paid.
