¹ Section 128 of the *Election Act* requires a 12-day delay before commencing final count, unless otherwise authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer.

² Section 139 of the *Election Act* requires a delay of six days between the proclamation of the successful candidate (at the conclusion of final count) and the return of the writ of election. This delay is to allow time for a voter, candidate or the District Electoral Officer to apply for a judicial recount.
